Jarvis Native Has Healed Sick For 45 Years

The Niagara Falls Review featured Dr. J. Harold Davidson, a Jarvis native, in a recent story. The article, written by Cheryl O'Neill, says that after 45 years as a doctor, Dr. Davidson believes in the art of medicine as well as the science. Dr. Davidson, who shares his office with his son, Dr. Peter Davidson and Dr. Douglas Blew, believes there is a practical side to medicine as well as what you learn from books. "You treat the patient not just carry out the textbook," he said. He enjoys the practice he and his partners have at Dorchester Manor because "half the people there are old friends and patients of mine." The desire to become a doctor began when he was growing up on a farm east of Jarvis "since I was old enough to appreciate what medicine did in the world."

Dr. Davidson has been a member of the Rotary Club, Kiwanas Club and is a member of the United Church. He came from Jarvis where many of his relatives still reside. - Condensed by Jessie Miller from Niagara Falls Review

Clined greatly, Dr. Davidson said. Dr. Davidson served on the Jepsen St. Hospital building committee, has been president of the Greater Niagara Medical Society three times and chief of staff at the hospital twice. He was Medicare Health officer in Niagara Falls from 1935 to 1963. Outside his medical work, Dr. Davidson is interested in gardening, woodworking and history. He and his wife, the former Emma Jane Smith of Niagara Falls, whom he married in 1932 have turned an acre of city land into country living, enhanced by 40 kinds of shrubs, ash, birch and maple trees, a vegetable, flower and rock garden. The home has won so many awards for landscaping and Christmas decorations that it is no longer eligible for competition. They do their own planting, but have a gardener to care for the grounds. Doctor Davidson is the author of the "History of Medicine in Niagara Falls" for the Reviews 50th Anniversary and a member of Ontario Medical Association's History Committee. He has his own history room in his house with 44 framed prints tracing big moments in medicine from 5000 B.C. to the present. He also has two large green scrapbooks on the coffee table - one containing memorabilia of his patient Leo Boyd in Texas, bringing people from the Niagara gorge and the hospital opening. The second book contains news events of his lifetime, the sinking of the Titanic, men on the moon, etc.
