The Friendship Club of the Nanticoke United Church held their annual Christmas Turkey Dinner in the church basement on Thursday evening.

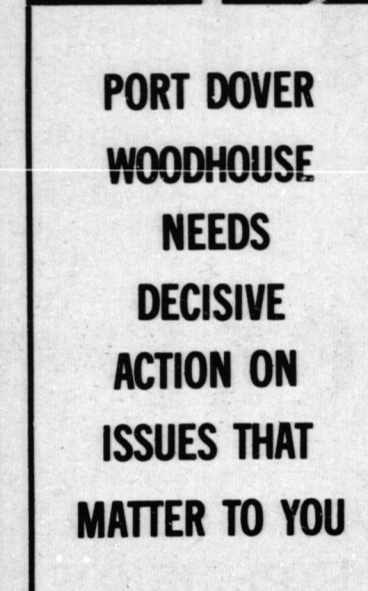
