The long scalloped veil, made by her mother, extended over her train. She carried a bouquet of white fugi mums, intermingled with orange delight roses and ferns.

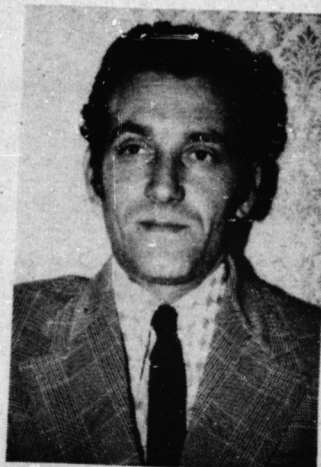
