And, he said the amendment (Bill 274) dictates a one - sided unfair form of arbitration because it effectively limits the arbitration board from making what it might consider a fair award if it exceeds government ceilings.

He also charged that the amendment "permits the minister who has imposed the ceilings to select the chairman of the arbitration board, thus reinforcing the possible bias of such arbitration".

Betty Isberg, president of the Haldimand Federation of Women, stressed their disagreement is not with the local board, but the government.

Anyone, regardless of the position they hold has the right to resign under the rules they were hired under, she
