Paul McCarthy gave the Flyers a one goal lead with just three minutes gone in the game. Terry Fryett dug the puck out of the corner and got it back where McCarthy pumped it home.

Tony Yacobino just stepped back on the ice after serving a penalty when he picked up a loose puck and raced in to beat John Wright with 12 seconds left in the first period. This was one of the few times in the game that Wright did not make the big save. He had robbed the Flyers several times and later in the game was to make five

point blank saves that border on the impossible.

Yacobino was also in on the last goal along with Paul Phibbs as they all batted at the puck before Dean Webb lifted it into the net. Dean also got a lesson in being a linesman as the referee made him retrieve the puck after Dean shot it down the ice after the whistle had blown.

Corvairs, Flyers Renew Acquaintances

For the first time since the 1971-72 hockey season, the Caledonia Corvairs will tangle with the Hagersville Flyers, but this time in an exhibition hockey match. The teams will face off on Wednesday, January 2nd in the Hagersville arena starting at 8 p.m. Both clubs, at one time, belonged to the Southern Counties Junior D League.

But since then, the Corvairs have moved into Junior C competition (last season winning the All Ontario Junior C Championship) and this season stepping up into a Junior B

League, where they currently find themselves in a tight race for a playoff position in a six team circuit that most scouts rate as the toughest B loop in the province.

The Flyer's fortunes in the Southern Counties loop took a decided upswing last season, when under the direction of former Caledonia minor

hockey coach Ken Morrison, the club finished in the playoffs for only the second time in their 8 year existence (a first place finish in the 1972 - 73 season as compared to a last place finish the year previous), and advanced into the All Ontario OHA Junior D semi - finals before being knocked off in a seventh game.

Three players from that Hagersville semi-final squad now find themselves in a Corvair uniform, and are rated highly by Caledonia coach Ches. Martindale. Right - winger Jim Nagle, at 15 years of age, is part of the highest scoring line in the league this year, and is currently among the top 10

scorers. Brother Bill Nagle has become a steady addition to the Caledonia blue - line corps, and goalkeeper Dick Tweedle returned to the Corvairs this year after spending 1/2 of last season with the Flyers, establishing himself as one of the fan favorites in Hagersville.

Fan interest in Hagersville for the exhibition tilt is already high, and the Flyers are ensured of a vocal home town following. It's expected many Corvair followers will invade the Hagersville arena to lend support to their favorites. Game time Wednesday, January 2nd is 8 p.m. Next week - a look at the teams through the eyes of the coaches.
