In the previous edition
of the OPP Press
Release, a mention
was made of a Break,
Enter and Theft at the
Domtar on #6 Highway,
Seneca Township, \$2000
worth of articles were
stolen. About six days
after the reported theft,

checked a car in that
city and recovered
approximately \$1450.00
worth of items stolen
from the Domtar. The
male occupant of the
vehicle was arrested
for stolen goods and
turned over to Prov.
Const. W.L. Eves of this
detachment.

On December 12th,
two escapees from the
Burch Industrial farm
near Brantford were
observed in the Hagers-
ville area by Const.
Mowat at the Hagers-
ville Police Depart-
ment. Both subjects
fled on foot and were
later apprehended on #6
Highway near the 4th
Line of Oneida by Prov.
Const. R.A. White of this
Detachment. The two

escapees were turned
over to Brantford
O.P.P.

On December 10th, a
Break, Enter and Theft
occurred at a Fish stor-
age shed owned by
George Jackson of Nan-
tooke. The following
articles were stolen:
1 Mastercraft belt
sander, 1 Black and
Decker sander, 1 Shop-
master power saw, 1
Mastercraft power saw,
2 Electric Drills, 1/4"
and 3/8".

At the same time of
the theft, windows were
broken in the building.

During the past week,
a quantity of marijuana
was seized by members
of this Detachment from
two separate vehicles
that were checked in this
area. Three youths have
been charged with poss-
ession of this drug.

A recent snowfall
caused a number of
collisions on highways
and rural roads in the
county. All told, twenty-
three collisions were

investigated resulting in
injuries sustained to one
person. The majority of
mishaps were caused by
drivers travelling at
speeds too fast for road
conditions. A number of
vehicles involved were
not equipped with snow

tires which possibly
could have prevented
some of these collis-
ions.
