how fair would it be to pick on one item and put a freeze on its cost? It appears that a food inquiry committee will be established to examine food prices. If this will satisfy the public, it may be a good exercise, but they can only come up with information already known.

Three years ago, when consumers complained about beef prices, the Ontario government held an inquiry which found the prices were justified. Beef production still has not been profitable enough to interest many new producers. O.F.A. has been approached to get into the beef carcass exporting business, but till now are not interested. So if its too expensive for consumers here, there is a market for it elsewhere.

Bell telephone has also done some studies on rising costs to use their purpose to justify a rate increase, and have found that since 1966, food costs have risen by 21%. During that same period, wages and salaries increased by 52%. That again shows that incomes are rising faster than food expenses.

A thorough inquiry will probably not change anything in food pricing, but it could be good for farmers. It would show what the costs are at the farm gate and what is added to put it on the grocer's shelf.

Mrs. Pearl Marr was the Mystery Prize winner. Three members contributed to the January Birthday Box.

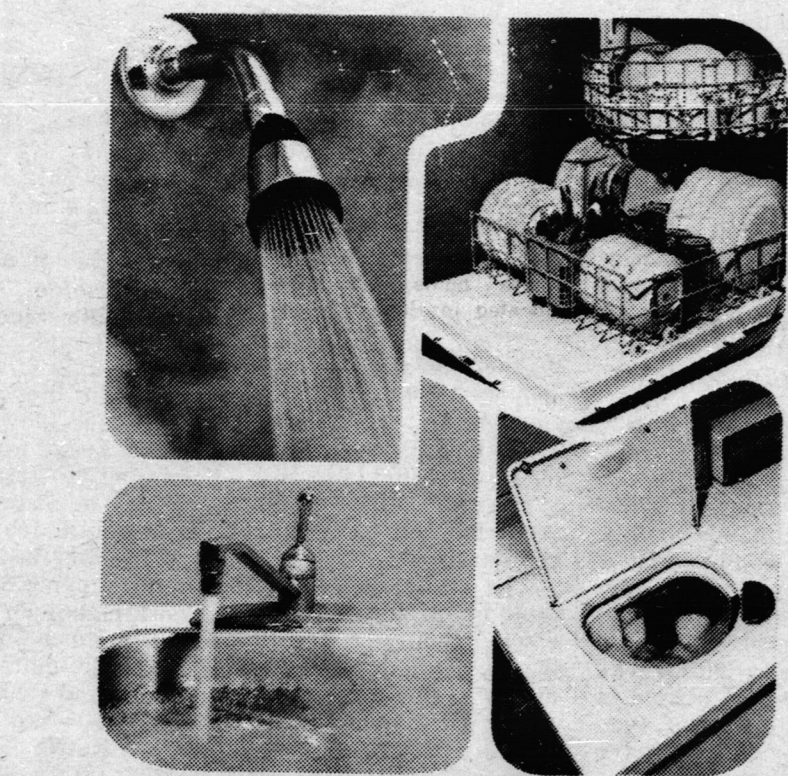
We all enjoyed a few relaxing games of "Card Bingo" with Mrs. Viola Smelser in charge of distributing interesting prizes to the winners.
