The month of January has been packed to overflowing with a variety of activities for your Member of Parliament. In the first week we had the Official Opening of the 29th Parliament. Vera was with me in Ottawa last week to attend the Governor General's Parliamentary Ball at Rideau Hall. This is the highlight of the social functions which our wives have the opportunity to share with their husbands.

The debate on the Speech from the Throne lasted eight days in which many of our new Members had the opportunity to make their maiden speeches. During this debate, it became all too evident that the NDP are going to support the Government to keep it in power indefinitely.

Following this rather general debate, the Government has finally introduced some specific legislation which has occupied the remainder of this month and some of which I will mention later in this letter.

My time was fully occupied on Saturday, January 27th from 10 a.m. till 1 p.m., in the village Council Chamber. Many people dropped in with a variety of personal problems which I was happy to discuss with them. These meetings are informal. No appointment is necessary. Come and meet your Member in Cayuga.

LEGISLATION BEFORE THE HOUSE

(a) Food Price Study: As proposed in the Throne Speech, the Government introduced a Motion to establish a Committee to investigate rising food prices. This was to be a joint Senate and House of Commons Committee. After Conservative amendments and considerable debate, it was decided that the Committee be composed only of Members of the House of Commons and that there be a time limit when the report must be presented to Parliament.

(b) Unemployment Insurance: It is common knowledge, and finally admitted by the Government, that the Unemployment Insurance Fund is nearly half a billion dollars in the red. Instead of asking Parliament to vote the necessary funds, as it could and should have done, the Government obtained the money, beyond the limit set by law, through Governor General's warrants. The Opposition feels that the Government has acted illegally.

Now we have Bill C-124 introduced to

raise the ceiling on the amount which the Government may take from general revenue to finance the unemployment insurance deficits. The debate has been vigorous and stormy as the Opposition sought further amendments to increase the number of weeks a person must work in order to qualify for benefits. We are desperately striving to correct this whole program so that it will be more profitable to work than to draw unemployment insurance benefits on too easy terms.

(c) Capital Punishment: The Government has introduced legislation to extend abolition of capital punishment, except for the murder of police and prison guards, for another five year trial period. This has evoked a spirited debate on a controversial issue which goes right to the roots of our society. Mail, phone calls and personal conversations indicate to me that the majority of the people whom I represent desire the retention of capital punishment for first degree murder. Everyone wants a stricter enforcement of our laws relating to bail and parole to ensure the protection of society.

Breakfast Bacon Meal

Consumers often ask "Why is breakfast bacon not leaner?" "Why don't processors trim off more of the fat?" The reason is very simple, say food specialists at the Ontario Food Council, Ministry of Agriculture and Food. Side bacon, for better or for worse, is always going to be one of the fatter pork cuts. It is the combination of lean and fat that gives side bacon such unique flavor and taste appeal.

While the fat on most pork cuts can be readily trimmed off, producing a product that's reasonably lean; with side bacon there is no possible way of trimming or removing the fat. The streaks of lean and fat are interwoven in such a way that any trimming is virtually impossible.

As it goes through the production line, bacon is sorted for a good proportion and distribution of the lean. Many packers have 2 or 3 brand names. They used one particular brand for all their first selection bacon, another one for their second selection, and so on.

READY FOR A FAMILY

Donny looks like a merry little soul and much of the time he is.

A lot of illness in his 14 months tested his temperament as he was in and out of hospital for treatment and tests, and of course, this delayed his opportunity for adoption. Now some of his troubles are over and others are dismissed as minor so the Children's Aid Society feels he is ready to become part of a family.

Anglo-Saxon in descent, Donny is an appealing baby with beautiful reddish-blond curly hair, big brown eyes and a delightful smile that shows at least some of his six teeth.

When Donny feels well, he is a happy, contented cuddly boy who laughs a lot and loves to hear his own voice squealing. He enjoys other children and is fascinated by small babies. Donny has developed more slowly than normal and is functioning from two to five months below his age. This pattern is expected to continue. His left arm and leg do not appear to be growing as fast as the right. Otherwise they are normal and the difference is barely noticeable. He may need surgery later on his left foot but this will not be known for a year.

Donny has a number of infections and has been tested for hydrocephalus (build-up of fluid inside the skull). There is no evidence of this but he is to have regular checks for a time - just in case.

Donny's problems do not mean that he requires more care than a normal, healthy child, but he does love attention. He eats and sleeps well and is on a regular diet. He can entertain himself but prefers to have company.

Heart-touching Donny needs parents who can take his medical history in their stride and whose academic expectations are not high.
