Women Aren't Equal In Canada

Canada is committed to a principle that emphasizes the common and equal status of women and men rather than a separate status for each sex.

But in 1970 the average male Canadian taxpayer had an income of \$7,550.00 and the average female Canadian taxpayer had an income of \$4,304.00.

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights has set the stage for a new society to be equally enjoyed and maintained by both sexes, stating: "All

human beings are born free and equal."

But of all employed women in Canada in 1970, one in three women worked as clerks, and only one in 33 women worked as managers.

The rights to equal opportunity, equal remuneration and the right of women to be free to choose whether or not to take employment outside the home which were the major thrusts of the 1970 Report of the Royal Commission on the Status of Women in Canada are of no value to women if there is no means of achieving those goals.

Recent research by Gibson Willoughby real estate brokers provides interesting comparisons:

In U.S.S.R. the majority of doctors are women;
In Canada 10.5 per cent of physicians and surgeons are women;

In Finland most dentists are women;
In Canada three per cent of dentists are women;

In France almost 50 per cent of pharmacists are women;
In Canada less than 15 per cent of pharmacists are women;

In 96 per cent of occupations men are paid more than women;
In 52 per cent of occupations men are paid 25 per cent more than women.

The pattern is consistent: male rates exceed female rates all down the line. Bert Willoughby, president of the Canadian Chapter of the International Real Estate Federation states that: "In Canada, consumer spending on goods is equally divided between men and women."

"The women generally controls the decision on home purchases and dominates consumer spending; but, some women have either been unable to secure loans in their own names, or reported the loss of credit cards through marriage, and received credit cards issued only in the husband's name."

"Although in Finland architecture is considered a suitable profession for women, only 2.9 per cent of architects in Canada are women."

"No women have ever worked as a trader on the floor of any stock exchange in Canada."

"And Metro Toronto police chief Harold Adamson, although welcoming women to the police force in Toronto, has indicated they will not be permitted to carry a gun or drive a patrol car."

According to John Gibson of Gibson Willoughby, "Data reports on earnings of women and men performing the same work are rare. However, available information reveals that on an average in all occupations women receive only 40 to nearly 70 per cent of men's earnings and that females in the managerial group make only 42.3 per cent of the earnings of males in the same group."

Statistics from the Women's Bureau of the Department of Labour tell another part of the story:

"Women sales workers earn about two-fifths of what men in similar positions earn. "Women managers, officials and proprietors earn slightly more than half of what men in equivalent situations earn and the gap has been widening rather than narrowing."

In 1960 the total number of working women was 1,657,000 or 25.8 per cent of labour force.

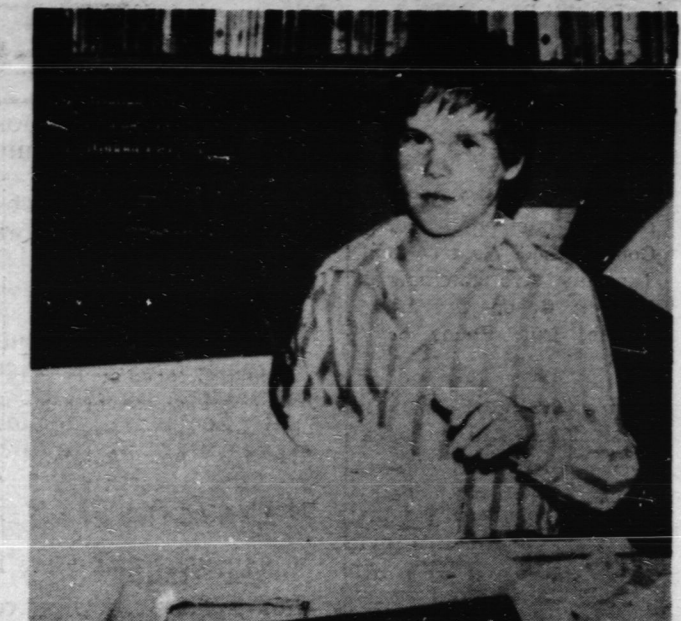

The total earnings of the 73 saleswomen at Gibson Willoughby exceeded those of the 77 salesmen by \$52,000.00. The average earnings of the saleswomen exceeded those of the salesmen by almost 12 per cent.

"In one branch of Gibson Willoughby, who are Canada's largest independently-owned real estate brokers, there are 20 salespeople: nine saleswomen and 11 salesmen."

"In 1970 the total earnings of the nine saleswomen exceeded those of the 11 salesmen by almost \$50,000.00. The pattern may be the same with other Metro brokers where similar proportions of saleswomen are employed."

"The earnings of the average saleswomen exceeded those of the average salesman by more than \$5,000.00 per year at one branch."

Another major Metro real estate broker is on record as wishing to hire only female sales personnel in the future.

"In real estate," according to John Gibson, "the major recommendations of the 1970 Royal Commission on the Status of Women are in practice now and have been for some time."

Women are welcome in real estate; but do not want equality with men.
