When a man drifts into
heavy drinking and de-
serts his family?

When a neighbour
takes a wrong turn in
life, it may cost the
public additional dollars
in welfare services
to feed and clothe a
family which has no
breadwinner, to provide
care for a baby born
out of wedlock. A boy
may start as a school
dropout and wind up a
prison inmate or nar-
cotics addict; his un-
productive life behind
bars costing an enor-
mous sum in money and
misery.

The Salvation Army
claims no magic cure-

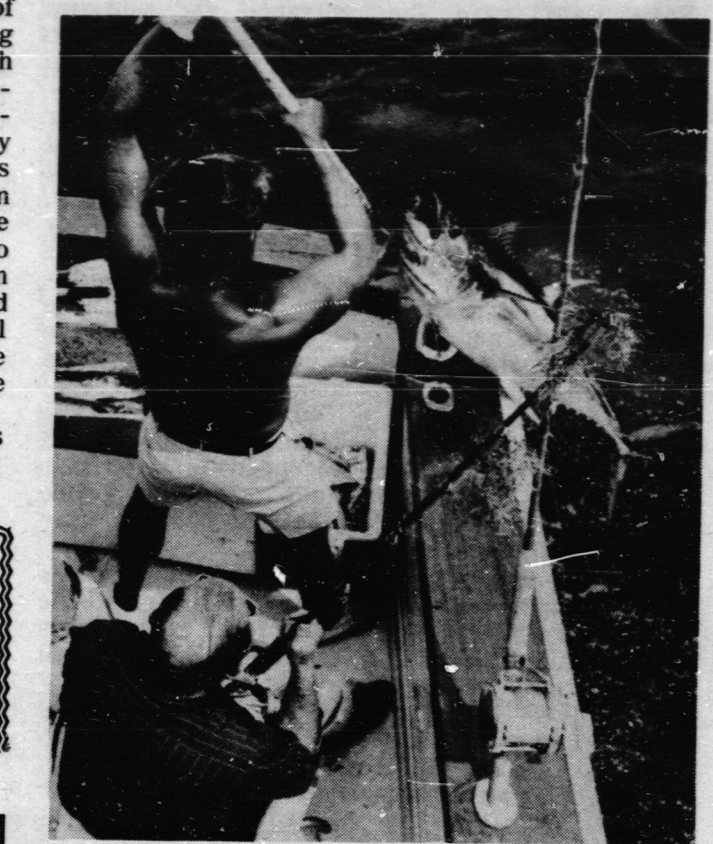

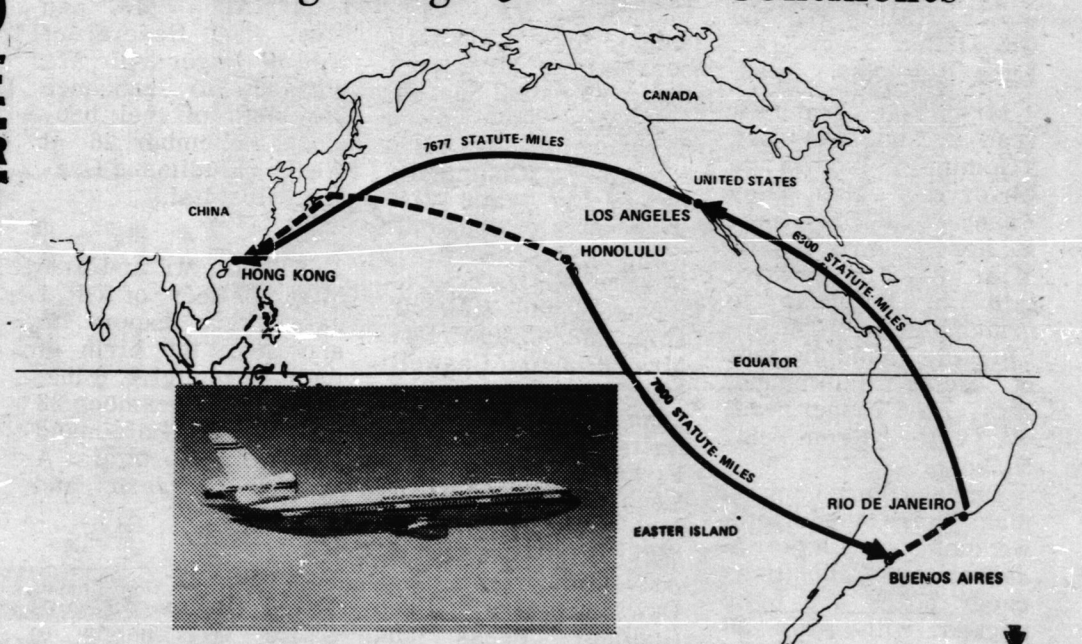
Those fishing stories are all true...

EVERYONE'S heard about
fishermen's tall stories.
They usually begin: "It was this
big (or that big)..." and it gets
bigger at each telling. But when
Captain Jerry Lewless, skipper
of the "Sara Lee" tells one,
people listen.
Here, Lewless gaffs a 46-pound
trout reeled in by a local execu-
tive. This is just one of many
such catches Capt. Lewless has
witnessed in these Bahamian
waters along the south shore of
Cat Island, now termed one of
the world's best deep sea fish-
ing areas.
The focal point of this virgin
fishing area is Hawk's Nest

Creek and the new Hawk's
Nest Fishing and Yacht Club,
located on the southwest tip of
the 50-mile-long Cat Island.
The fishing is equally good at
Walker Cay, Abaco, where a
10-pound rainbow trout has
been caught in February, and a
10-pound bonefish in March.
April is an especially busy
month. Fishermen have reeled
in blue marlins as big as 600
pounds, as well as a 110-pound
white marlin, a 46-pound all-
ston tuna and a 50-pound sail-
fish. In short, the fishing here is
as good one month as it is the
next.

Three World Nonstop Records

New Long Range Jet Links Continents



Latest advances in aviation technology are bringing faraway places ever closer to home, as was dramatized when one of the world's newest jetliners, the McDonnell Douglas DC-10, recently set three world nonstop flight records in a single week. In a dramatic demonstration of its long range capabilities, the first intercontinental model of the wide-cabin tri-jet spanned 7,677 miles from Los Angeles to Hong Kong in 14 hours, 44 minutes
