Latest advances in aviation technology are bringing faraway places ever closer to home, as was dramatized when one of the world's newest jetliners, the McDonnell Douglas DC-10, recently set three world nonstop flight records in a single week. In a dramatic demonstration of its long range capabilities, the first intercontinental model of the wide-cabin tri-jet spanned 7,677 miles from Los Angeles to Hong Kong in 14 hours, 44 minutes. Three days later, the huge, quiet plane flew 7,800 miles from the Pacific island city of Honolulu to Buenos Aires, Argentina, far below the equator, in 14 hours and 18 minutes. To end the week, the new DC-10 took less than 12 hours, to fly the 6,300 miles from Rio de Janeiro, Brazil to Long Beach, California — where McDonnell Douglas produces the 250 to 380 passenger jetliner.

In one week's flying — more than 30,000 miles in 571/2 hours — the far ranging DC-10 spanned the far Pacific, crossed the equator, soared over the Andes mountains and Amazon jungle, then cruised over Central America and up the length of Mexico to touch down in Southern California — and proved the world will never be as large again.
