Beef Heifers

Studies at the Agriculture Canada Fredericton, N.B., Research Station show that beef heifers can safely calve before going to market without lowering their grade.

A calf from every heifer could be the answer to increasing calf production in marginal beef herds.

A preliminary experiment suggests that by breeding beef heifers, a farmer can have both a market animal and a replacement calf without increasing the number of cows or greatly raising the maintenance of his herd.

Freddy walks well and talks a good deal. His vocabulary is limited, as you would expect, but he tries to repeat everything said to him.
