**\$20,000 Grant For Taquanyah Area**

The Honourable Leo Bernier, Minister of Natural Resources and Mr. James N. Allan, M.P.P. for Haldimand-Norfolk, announce the approval of a provincial grant of \$20,000 to the Grand River Conservation Authority for the Taquanyah Conservation Area.  
This Area comprises some 270 acres of land located on the head waters of Mill Creek, one mile north of Highway No. 3 and two miles west of the Village of Cayuga, being part of Lots 40 to 43 inclusive, Concession I, in the Township of North Cayuga, County of Haldimand.  
The area is being developed to create a water storage area and increase stream flow; to provide for operation of the area as a fish and wildlife management demonstration, the production of young water-fowl and upland game management and to provide some recreation facilities.  
Development work which the Authority proposes to carry out during the current fiscal year includes ground development such as grading, seeding and sodding, reforestation and planting of landscape trees; additional work on the information and nature centre, together with displays and furnishings; road construction; erosion control work; provision of additional picnic facilities and other general development work.  
All member municipalities will bear the Authority's share of the cost.

**WHEN PORK IS DONE**

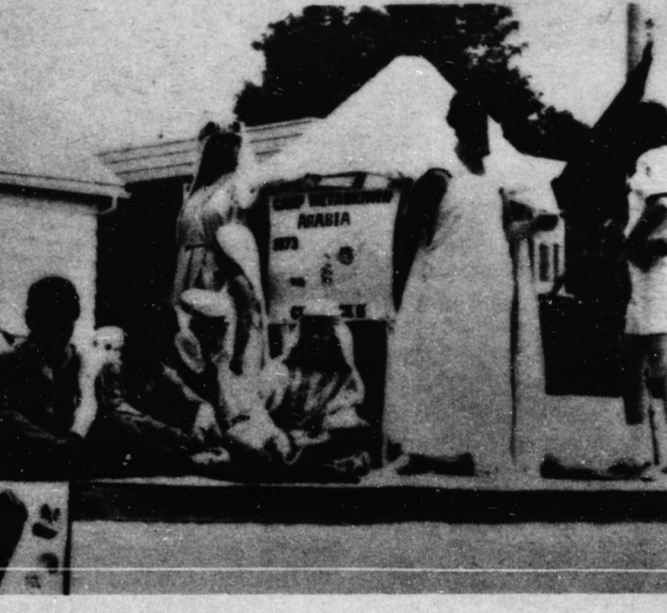

**Retiring Don't Carry Extra Gas**

An urgent warning on the dangers of hoarding fuel was issued recently from the Hamilton Automobile Club to motorists travelling in the United States.  
The Club has been informed by the American Automobile Association that some motorists are carrying extra cans in their car trunks as insurance against running out of fuel on the highway.  
In case of an accident, what might ordinarily be a minor mishap could become disastrous under these conditions and if a chain reaction should occur, the results could be a holocaust.  
Gasoline stored in cans inside a hot trunk can expand and overflow, increasing the risk of ignition by sparks from a crash or from a lit cigarette.  
Even if a motorist should become stranded because of lack of gasoline supplies, the inconvenience could not be compared to the casualties that could result from cars carrying extra fuel.
