As we head for the annual summer clean-up automobile sales, it's time for a list of do's and don'ts to help you get the best deal on your next car.

Summer savings are real but even though brand new car depreciation starts in Sep tember and amounts to about 18% by the end of the first year, whether the car is in your garage or the dealer's show-

The worst time to buy a car is during the first 60 days after introduction in the fall, when demand is high and stocks are low.
