## Coronation Carillon To Be Dedicated

On Sunday, July 15th at 2 p.m. at the Springvale United Church, a special service of Dedication will be held. At this time, a gift to the Church in the form of a Coronation Carillon, will be presented by Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Harvey and the members of their families.

This Coronation Carillon is an exclusive development of Schuler Carillons, Inc., of Sellersville, Pennsylvania, U.S.A. The instrument consists of 25 miniature bell units of bronze ball metal which are struck by metal hammers, producing exact bell tones almost inaudible to the human ear. These bell vibrations are then amplified over 100,000 times by means of specially designed electronic equipment, producing true bell tones which are far superior to the tones of traditional cast bells of massive proportions. The instrument, which will be dedicated in the Springvale United Church on Sunday, July 15th at 2 p.m., provides the tonal equivalent of 79,462 pounds of cast bells tuned to the finest English standards. The range is G below middle C to G two octaves above, and it is interesting to know that the low G bell is equal in tone to a cast bell weighing 13,250 pounds.

The Coronation Carillon will be played from a special keyboard located at the organ console. Selector switches will permit the bells to be heard within the Church alone, or together. Also part of the new bell instrument is the MagnaBell Tape Player. The tape player utilizes pre-recorded magnetic tape cartridges of Carillon selections and is controlled automatically by a 24 hour programme clock.

Everyone is invited to attend the service of Dedication and to hear the beautiful tones of the Carillon when it is played during the service.

Continued From Page 1 and lease the structure back to the village. Plans for the proposed fire hall, which would be built on Almas Street across from the old sale barn, call for a six bay fire hall, police offices and ample parking space. It would be leased by the village at \$675 per month, provided they took care of utilities, minor repairs, decorating and taxes.

Another alternative, suggested Monday, would be to have a cottage styled fire unit with one section in the core area and another in the north end.

"Maybe we shouldn't be putting two eggs in one basket," Councillor Robert Gedye said.

When a train is crossing Highway 6 in the village, the north end is unprotected, he said. A train could hold firemen up for ten minutes. "Ten minutes doesn't sound too long, but if your house is burning down..."

Mr. Gedye suggested that perhaps the present fire hall could be fixed up and then a second two bay building be put in the north end.

At the last council meeting in June, Fire Chief Bill McClarty proposed the Community Centre be renovated into a four bay fire hall. He said the Centre is not a "money making deal" and he questioned whether the building was being used primarily by Hagersville citizens on the weekend.

He estimated the Centre could be turned into a fine four bay fire hall with paved parking lot, storage area, meeting room, kitchen and washroom facilities for approximately \$20,000. Hagersville village fathers agreed to look into the matter and that a general meeting would be held to hear public feelings.

Also at council: Council accepted Don Howden's quote of \$385 for painting the municipal office. This cost

## Jarvis Firemen May Seek Increase

The Jarvis Volunteer Fire Department will probably ask for an increased fire rate similar to the Hagersville department, Reeve William Austin told council at Tuesday night's meeting.

The Hagersville and District fire agreement terms have not been settled yet, but they are requesting fire rate of \$150 for the first hour and \$100 per hour for each additional hour up to a maximum of \$450. "We're getting some 'static' from the Jarvis firemen, Mr. Austin said. They would like similar remuneration. If they were able to build up a fund, they could upgrade their equipment without always having to ask for extra money, he explained.

However, nothing can be done until the Hagersville and area agreement is settled.
