Mr. Torensma's property. Luckily, Mr. Torensma noticed the train and jumped to safety just before the collision. The front end of the tractor, which was totally demolished, was dragged 2,260 feet.

Mr. Torensma sustained a minor laceration to his foot. He was treated at the West Haldimand General Hospital and released.

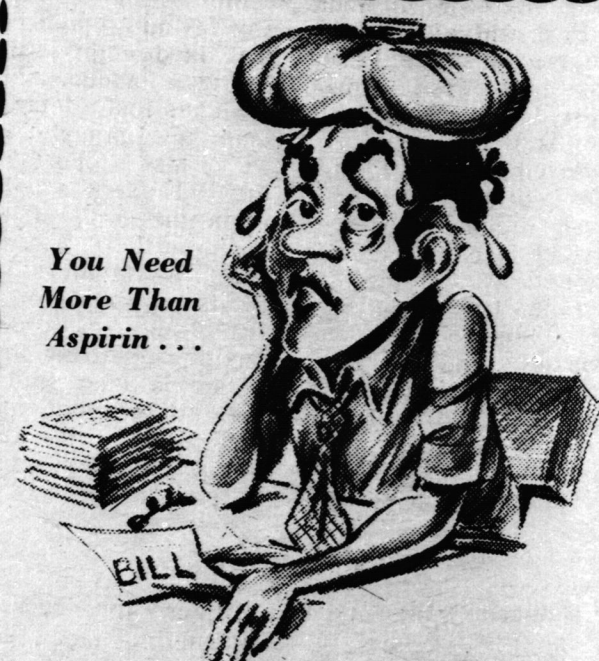
