

### Study Recommends Urban Centre For Woodhouse

Note: The Haldimand-Norfolk Study report's proposals for a satellite city, Nanticoke, Jarvis, Hagersville, and Cayuga growth, airport, highways and schools are outlined in the following article.

14,000 acres optioned for residential development in the Walpole-Townsend area is not the site recommended by the Haldimand-Norfolk Study for a satellite city. The land use report, prepared by Nigel Richardson and released by Treasurer John White in the legislature last Thursday afternoon, places large scale residential growth in the Port Dover-Simcoe area, with moderate growth expected in area towns and villages. An area bounded by Highway 3, the Lynn River and Black Creek

in Woodhouse township is the suggested site for a city of 100,000-150,000 people.

The "Woodhouse New Town" area was chosen over two other spots located in Oneida township and Rainham-South Cayuga townships because it is more ideally suited.

The report said this area between Port Dover and Simcoe meets the following criteria:

- \* It is well related to existing transportation networks.
- \* It is within easy commuting distance of

Nanticoke, without being so close as to be threatened by significant air pollution.

\* It can readily and economically be supplied with water and sewerage.

\* Proximity to Simcoe and Port Dover can alleviate such problems as the lack of community and commercial services in the early stages of development, while also providing a resource of local leadership. It will also reduce the risk of a

### Study Advocates Two Tier Region

The counties of Haldimand and Norfolk should be combined into a two tier regional municipality comprising of six local municipalities, the Haldimand-Norfolk study recommends.

The report on the restructuring of local government, which was prepared by study director Nigel Richardson, was presented in the legislature last Thursday by Treasurer John White.

Much of the report incorporates the thinking of the Haldimand-Norfolk joint study committee (local representatives), but was offered by Mr. White as a "basis for discussion" only.

Arthur Meen, parliamentary assistant to the treasurer, said at a meeting of local poli-

ticians in Jarvis Thursday night "that these reports are offered to you simply as one man's proposals, and before the government takes a position in regard to them, there will be ample opportunity for you to comment and make suggestions on both the planning report and the report on local government."

Mr. Richardson suggested that the single two tier region, which will reduce the number of area municipalities from 28 to six, should be regarded as an interim measure and should again be reviewed when it has been in existence for ten years.
