Mrs. Stalker refused Mrs. Brechin's claims that marketing boards have artificially pushed the cost of eggs, milk, and broiler chickens too high. "Farmers are aware that the price to the consumer is up. But is the consumer aware how long -- how unbearably long -- the price to the farmer was down below the cost of production?

"The Consumers' Association would be worth its salt if it explained what goes on between the farm and the dinner table."

Mrs. Stalker, an egg producer herself, adds, Between March, 1970 and June, 1972 when the egg board was given the power to set prices, eggmen lost between 50c and \$2 a bird. The producing side of the industry lost \$20-million last year. Farmers received as little as 17¢ a dozen when it cost 32¢ a dozen to produce
