
The July meeting will be a picnic at the home of Mrs. Clifford McLean

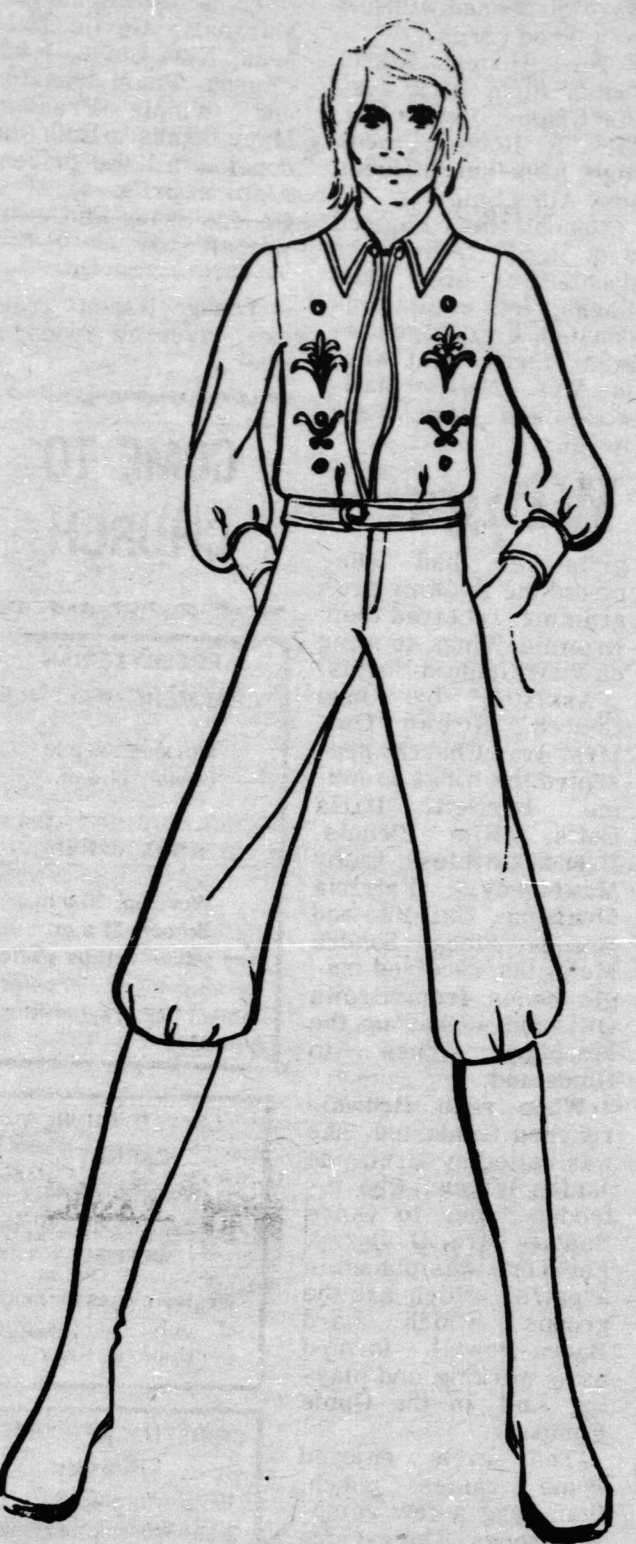
