## World Day Of Prayer

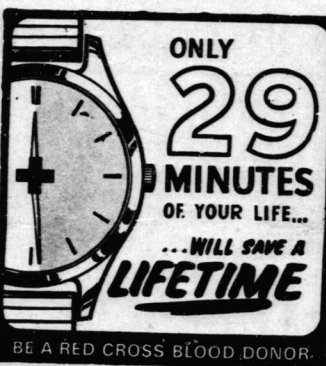
