The only team St. George Lions couldn't beat during the regular season of the OHA Southern Junior D Hockey League was Hagersville Flyers. Now that the two teams are meeting head on in the finals, things haven't changed a bit.

The Flyers, first-place finishers during the regular season, took back-to-back wins over St. George on the weekend and both games had a lot in common.

The Flyers now carry a 2-0 lead in the best-of-seven series.

More than 1,600 took in the two games on the weekend and saw the clubs battle through a scoreless first period in both games. St. George also took the lead in both games, scoring in the middle period.

Fogarty got his second and Watson completed his hat trick in the third period. Dennis Smith picked up three assists with Hal Brown and Kevin Smith having two assists.

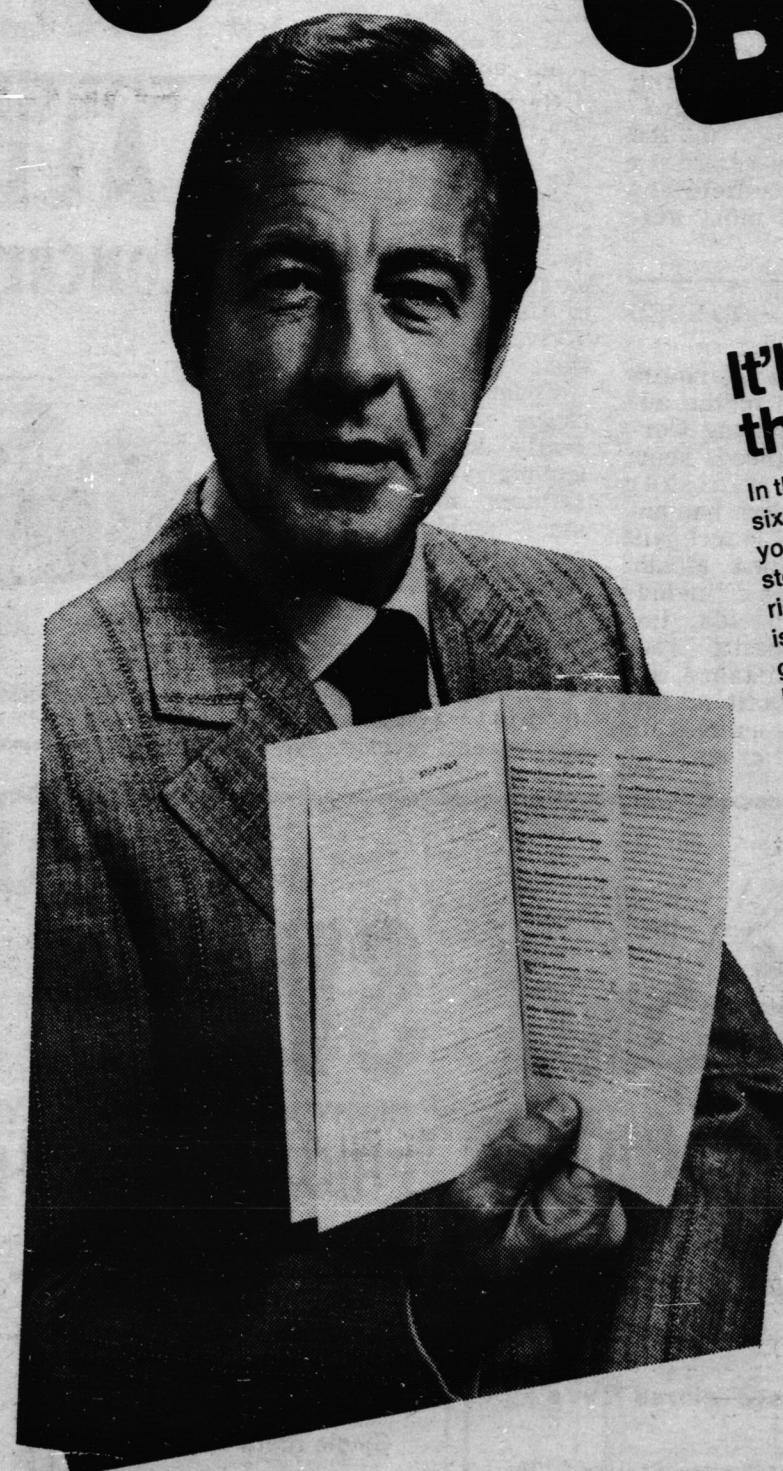
Ice Review

Eight year old Michel Kristensen and seven year old Craig Fleury took part in "Ice Review," which was put on by the Port Dover Figure Skating Club.

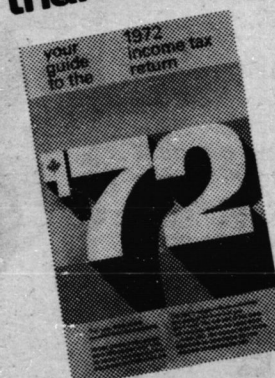
Michel was a frog and Craig was a skunk in the Saturday evening and Sunday afternoon performances.
