It is a most unlikely event to find all clergy getting together on a busy Sunday morning at one place; but it is indicative of a new spirit of co-operation among the various denominations and of mutual respect; it is also unmistakable evidence of the high regard with which each holds Mr. Ramrattan. During his four years as minister in Jarvis and area he has won many friends who wish him very well indeed in his years of ministry still ahead.

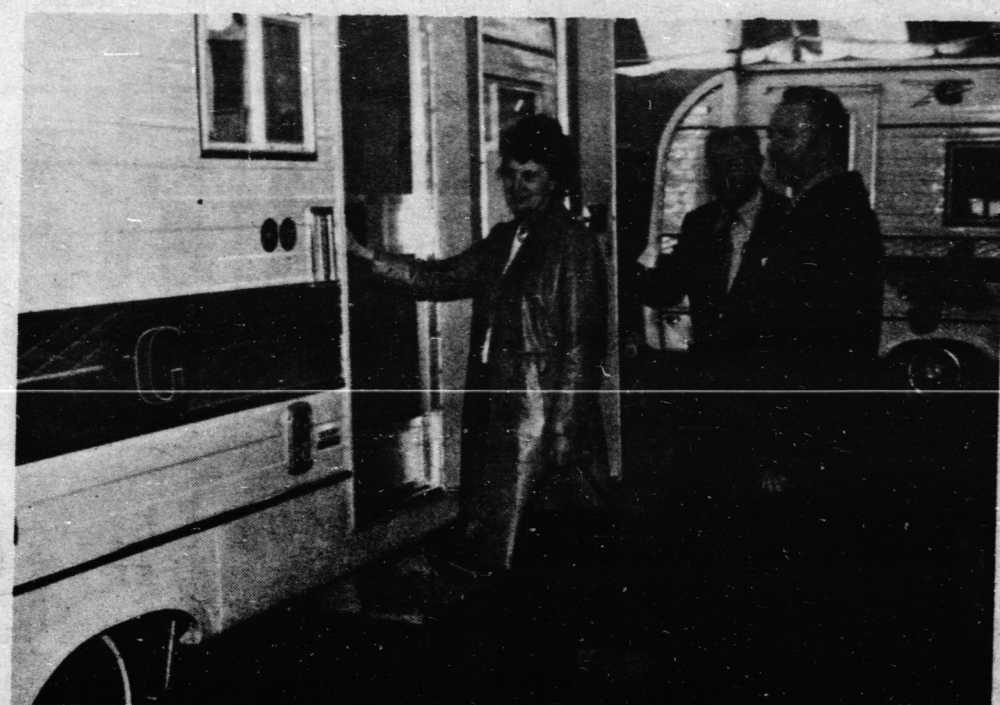
MacPherson, Steve Betteridge, Fred Wilcox and William Dunn.

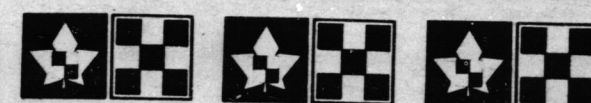

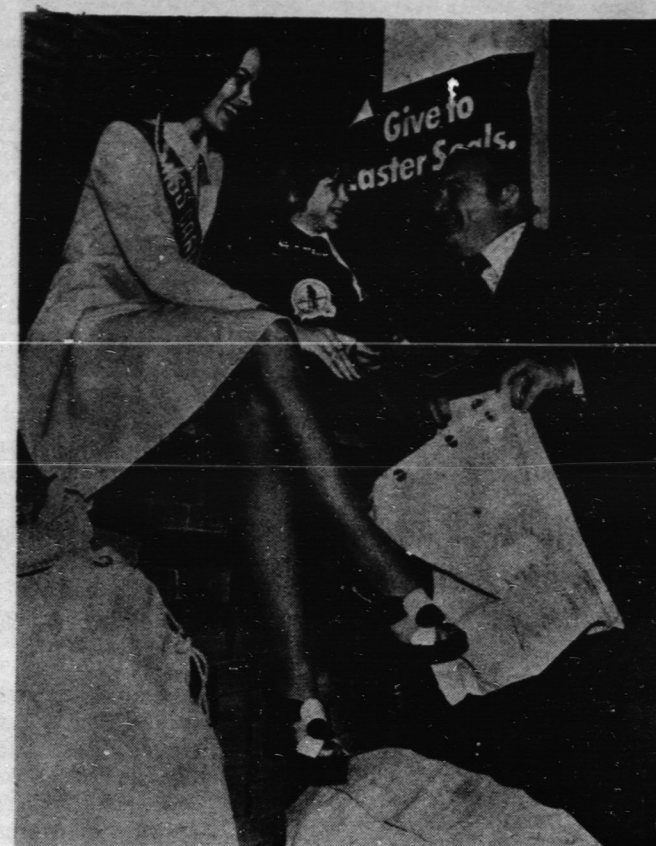
