### Attitudes Must Change

#### With Methods

Tooth decay is Canada's most prevalent disease, affecting 95 per cent of the population and costing \$250 million in dental bills alone.

A sadder fact is that while dentistry has developed new methods to control decay and gum disease, neither the public nor the dental profession is putting this knowledge to thorough use.

Preventive dentistry demands serious readjustment in the thinking of patients and their dentists. The patient should visit his dentist twice yearly and faithfully do the homework prescribed. More time and concern is needed on the part of the dentist who should draw up individual programs to protect the teeth of each patient.

Although sounding complicated and irksome, preventive dentistry in the long run is less complex, less costly and less painful than the old repair-slanted dentistry.

From birth until the pre-teen age, while permanent teeth are forming, every child should have fluoride in his drinking water, in vitamin preparations or in chewable tablets.

Fluoride is taken into the enamel of developing teeth making them resistant - although not immune - to decay.

Additional resistance is built into baby and permanent teeth by top-

premolars. Unless count-

ered, the eruptive force of the wisdom teeth can damage or twist their neighbours out of position.

Other times, partial eruption causes pain and swelling of surrounding gums, which is generally treated before extraction. Your dentist may refer you to an oral surgeon if the condition is bad. Extraction car cost from \$25 to \$100 depending on how far the tooth is impacted into supporting bone.

Rarely complications mean hospitalization. With today's equipment a dentist can usually remove a wisdom tooth in less than 30 minutes - barring complications. You may go through a day of pain after extraction and a week or two of mild discomfort.

### Local Libraries Receive Grants

Ontario's 372 local, county and regional libraries will receive provincial grants totaling \$13,840,000 this year. The Honourable Jack McNair, Minister of Colleges and Universities announced Monday.

This represents an increase of 58.5 per cent over last year's allocation of \$8,730,000, he said, and reflects the government's desire "to provide the highest

possible quality of library service throughout the province."

Basic grants to municipal and county public library boards, which are based on population, have been doubled to \$1.35 from 65 cents per capita, using the latest published population figures for each area.
