A farmer faces more risks than most people. Accidental injury or sickness can seriously affect his work and livelihood. And there's always the risk of injury or property damage involving others.  
A salesman, buyer or friend may be injured while visiting the farm. A farm animal might stray and damage someone else's property. Farm equipment may injure others. Chemicals used in spraying may be carried by the wind to a neighbour's property, ruining his crop. Legal action resulting from any of these occurrences could cost the farmer his entire savings and even his farm.

protects the farmers against such a loss. A good farm family protection plan is available from Co-Operators Insurance Association of Guelph. The Ontario Federation of Agriculture is a sponsor of CIAG, which has offices and representatives throughout the province.  
The plan covers a farmer and his family against legal liability for death, bodily injury and property damage. It includes limited accidental death and impairment benefits for the family, and covers some medical expenses of visitors and others injured on the farm property or through the family's action.

## Ladies' Golf News

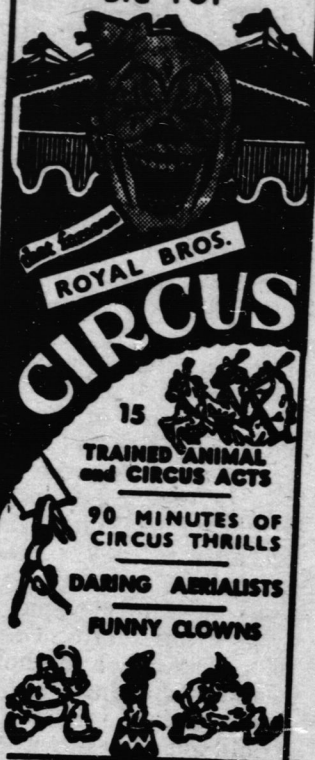

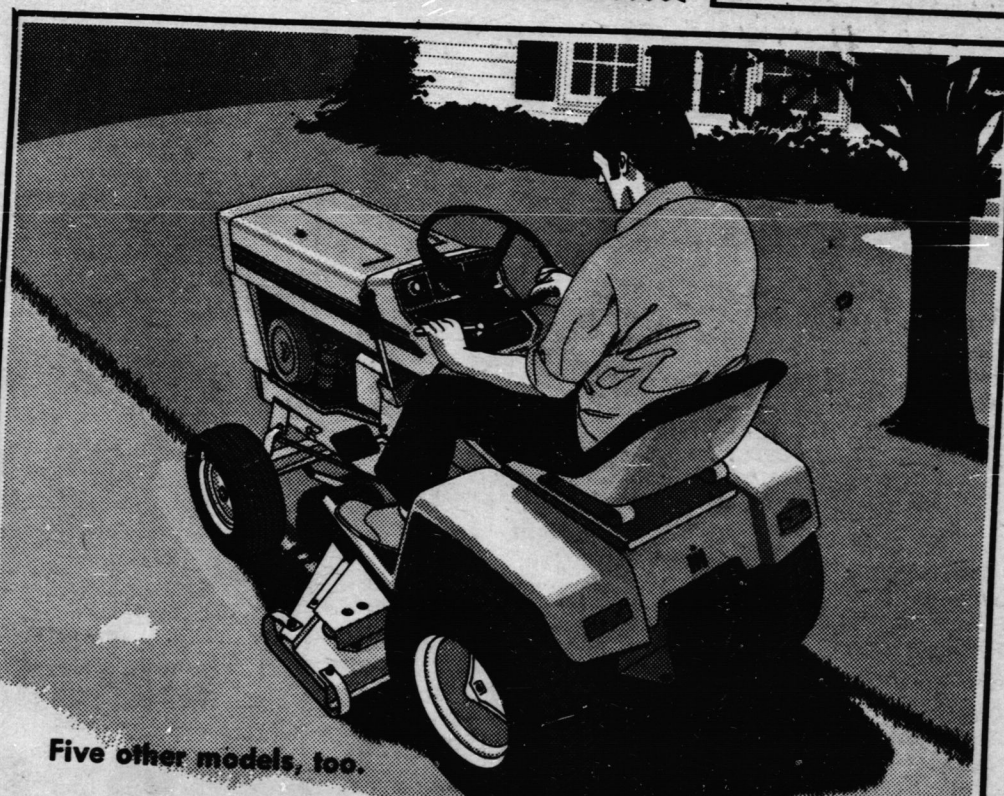

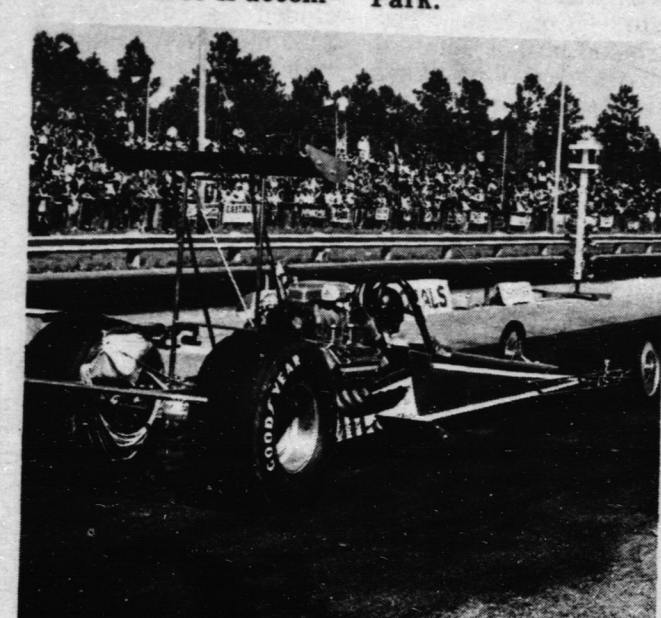

## On The Farm Front

The deadline date for applications under the OMMB Graduated Entry program is May 15. Industrial milk producers who have been shipping milk since July 1, 1968, have a federal subsidy quota and wish to obtain their free part of the Group 1 market should get an application form from the area fieldman, Douglas Johnston, Caledonia. Prospective applicants will be required to have a milkhouse and bulk tank meeting the specifications of the Milk Quality Branch.

Chemsil, a silage additive containing formic acid will be marketed by Celanese of Canada Ltd. through United Co-Operative of Ontario (U.C.O.) and Canadian Industries Ltd. (C.I.L.). Marketing is to begin this year.

Formic acid has been used widely in Europe for many years and has been tested on several farms in Ontario in the last two years. It is used mainly on direct-cut forages. Formic acid application results in silage with a pleasant aroma, eliminating the foul odours formerly associated with direct-cut material.

The direct-cut system does away with problems of wilting or drying forages to make wilted silage or hay. It allows farmers to harvest their perennial forage at the proper stage and to make top quality high protein silage with little weather dependency.

Formic acid does not take the place of good silo management. Because of the high moisture content, direct-cut forage should be stored in horizontal silos or piles. These should be well packed and sealed with plastic. Formic acid can be applied at the

harvester or at the blower.  
Formic acid is not cheap, but when a farmer considers the cost of protein, he can afford to spend money to obtain top quality forage. The formic acid system compares favourably with other methods of harvesting and storing perennial forages. Animals fed direct-cut forage perform at least as well as those fed on wilted silage or hay.

The Haldimand Beef Improvement Association has planned a Bus Trip to tour three different beef operations in Elgin County. Farms to be visited include cow-calf operations and a slatted floored feed lot. This bus trip has been scheduled for Tuesday June 5, 1973, and the cost is \$3.00 per person in advance. Reserved bus seats can be arranged by contacting Robert Thompson, John von Hugo county directors of the H.B.I.A. or the Agricultural Office.
