Phil Hare Elected Director Of R.L.A.

Reviving rural communities, the theme of the Rural Learning Association of Ontario, held at the Kemptville College of Agricultural Technology was not a course in life saving technique nor was it one of transplant. It dealt constructively with the change taking place in rural communities across Ontario.

Some sixty delegates in their first session Friday evening spoke strongly about the changes taking place in their own communities - larger communities, consolidation of school areas and local government and the migration of people from rural areas to the city and urban people coming to the country. These migrations seemed to be the common concern and there were varied reactions to these migrations.

This discussion led into Saturday's topic, the ideal community and what R.L.A. and the individual could do. A panel chaired by Jim Purvis, sociology Department of KCAT with members Mrs. Freda Kamstra, South Gillies, Frank Ritchie, R.L.A.

staff, Rudi Dallenbach, McDonald College and Allen McIntosh. Almonte spoke on the various aspects of the changing rural community. Group discussion followed to consider the problems posed by the questions of what is the ideal community. Results from these deliberations showed that the ideal varied as people varied and went from the theoretical to exact specifications of a community.

The role of the individual and R.L.A. was considered to be one of promoting understanding, resolving conflict between governments and people, promoting creativity, providing opportunities for leadership and bridging the gap between decision makers and the people.

Raymond Armstrong from Manitoulin Island testified to the beneficial influence on him personally from coming in contact with R.L.A. through the folk school program. He changed from "being the worst drunk on the reserve" to a responsible citizen sharing his experiences

in R.L.A. with other members of the race. Nine directors were elected on Saturday evening for the year 1973-74 as follows: Mark Douglas, Hama Reserve; Phil Hare, Nanticoke; Herb Hare, Carp; Betty Japperson, Guelph; John Malo, Simcoe; Bea McCue, Keswick; Armande Seguin, Noelville; Marjorie Slade, Kincardine and Bud Weaver, Thunderbay. At their first directors meeting the executive will be elected.

Marjorie Slade, chairman for 1972-73 outlined the itinerary for the R.L.A. European trip in June. Victor Morrow, staff R.L.A. gave a brief summary of proposed plans for the coming year which include more intercultural schools, forty leadership seminars with the Ontario Federation of Agriculture, a writers workshop and a possible human relations workshop with a participating sponsor.

Presentations were made to the staff, Kay Lapointe, Victor Morrow and Frank Ritchie.
