Believe it or not, but a thin strip of a combination of neatsfoot and mineral oils applied from the shoulder to the rear flank of cattle prevents bloat. The Canada Department of Agriculture researchers have not found out why but in controlled experiments the treatment has practically eliminated bloat in cattle fed on fresh alfalfa.


