On The Farm Front

In recent months the
Ontario Ministry of Ag-
riculture and Food has
been printing FACT-
SHEETS on many agric-
ultural topics. The fact-
sheets in many cases
are replacing publica-
tions or pamphlets be-
cause they are easier
and cheaper to produce
and to revise when re-
quired.

In addition, factsheets
can be quite specific
about current topics and
information. Fact-
sheets, publications and
farm building plans are
available without charge
from the county agric-
ultural office.

minated bloat in cattle
fed on fresh alfalfa.

Mr. Taylor briefly
outlined the organ-
ization's involvement in
improving government
policy or making rec-
ommendations: Animal
Medicine Act; Line
Fence Act; Pollution and
Pesticides; the pro-
posed Hydro Trans-
mission Corridor;
Farm Labor Crisis;
Land Use Policies;
Farming Ways and
means of improving it
and the Capital Gains
Tax.

Mr. Taylor also told
the audience that 42
acres went out of pro-
duction every minute last
year.

Of the 27,000 parcels
of farmland sold last
year, only 6,000 were
to bona fide farmers,

he said the remainder
went elsewhere.

GRANTS

For the period from
November 1, 1972 to
October 31, 1973, the
Haldimand Federation
of Agriculture received
\$3,725 in grants from
local municipalities.

What happens with
this funding after the
implementation of reg-
ional government, a

member of the audience
asked.

"I would hope we
would be able to negot-
iate new deals with
whatever type of
government we have
from here on in...."
Otto Crone said. And,
he felt the organization
should be important
enough that a change in
government should not
financially jeopardize
it.

final step is a fish pond
test.

If fish survive in the
water two days, it's
suitable to flow into the
lake, he said. If not,
it is shot back for
further treatment.

Texaco is building a
\$200 million refinery
near Nanticoke which
will ultimately have the
capacity of 95,000
barrels a day.

Tenders close the
first week of December
and construction will
begin in the early part of
1974. It is expected the
plant will be completed

two years from its
starting date.
