## Bylaw Officers Needed For Rural Areas After April 1

Bylaw enforcement officers will have to be hired for rural areas after the implementation of regional government in Haldimand - Norfolk next April.

Under Bill 226, an act to amend the Regional Municipality of Haldimand - Norfolk Act, rural areas will continue to be covered by the Ontario Provincial Police. However, this

force refuses to act on local bylaws.

As of April 1st, municipal police forces along with the Norfolk County Police will form the H-N Regional Police Force. They will enforce bylaws.

At a meeting of the Haldimand - Norfolk Joint Study Committee held here in Jarvis Wednesday, a councillor pointed out to Arthur Meen, parliamentary assistant to John White, that there was no provision in the bill for the enforcing of rural bylaws.

Mr. Meen replied that a \$5 per capita regional policing grant will be given right across the board, despite the continuation of O.P.P. This should assist the municipal council in a substantial way to pay for bylaw enforcement, he said.

The regional police will be restricted to their existing jurisdiction, legal advisor Ian Reid told the group.

With two forces acting in the area (local and O.P.P.), there's bound to be confusion until the regional police force is extended to cover the whole area, he said.

## Stelco To Begin Phase 1 Construction Next Year

An increase of 500 workers will be in the Nanticoke area by next summer.

J. P. Gordon, president of the Steel Company of Canada announced Thursday the company will begin construction early in 1974 on the first phase of an integrated steelmaking plant on its 6,600 acre property near here.

Mr. Gordon told reporters at a meeting in Nanticoke this first

phase represents the largest single development ever undertaken by a Canadian steel-maker.

He expects the labor force to gradually increase from 500 in the summer of '74 to 2,500 - 3,000 during the peak construction period. The plant, which is slated to begin production in 1977, will employ about 1500 with the completion of phase 1.

Production facilities scheduled to be constructed during this period include a blast furnace; a two-furnace basic oxygen shop; a double strand continuous casting machine for the production of slabs; and a semi-computerized 80" continuous hot strip mill. It will provide Stelco with a 1.3 million ton annual capacity.

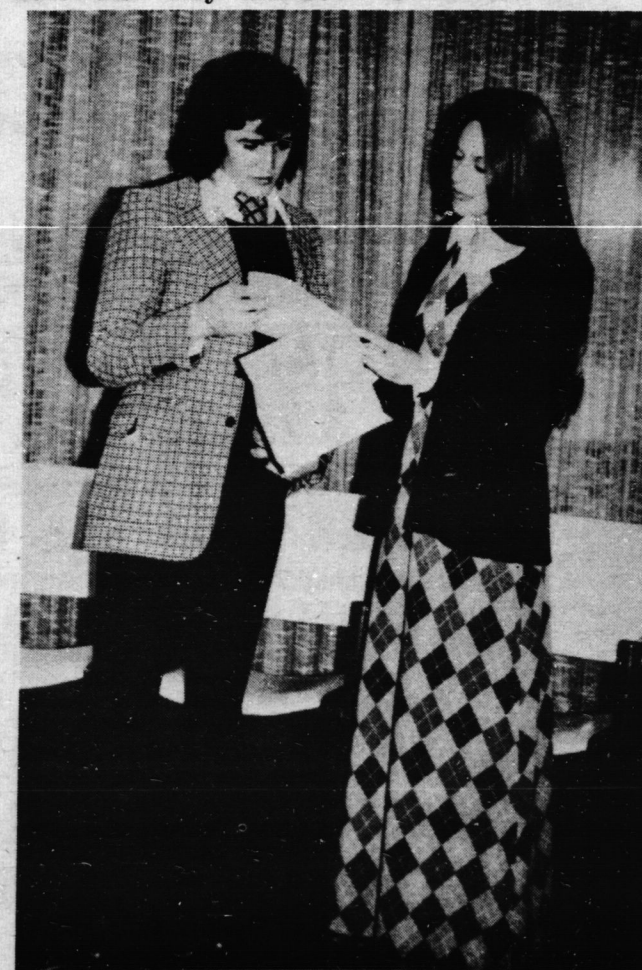
How can we make learning enjoyable for ourselves, he asked.
