process of change from  
within." Donald Hill, vice-  
principal of the school,  
also spoke to the grad-  
uates — a last chance  
to lay a few things on  
the line.

He pointed out to the  
packed audience that To  
Be Young Today is not  
just to enjoy the com-  
forts their forefathers  
didn't have, but also to  
suffer and cope with  
many problems which  
didn't plague their fore-  
fathers. The generation  
gap, mode of dress,  
morals, sex, welfare  
and many more are all  
complexities of this  
society.

He urged students
