

# Red Cap 252 Attracts Top Drivers

The top five drivers from each of the 11 major Ontario race tracks will meet in a true "Race of Champions" when the late model Super Stock season gets underway next May.

Carlings, who sponsor the track championships at the 11 tracks,

have signed with Cayuga International Speedway, Canada's fastest super speedway, to host the 1974 Red Cap 252. The event will be held at a different track each year in the seasons to follow.

Since several of the circuits have slightly

different rules governing their tracks and cars, every possible system will be employed to make the Red Cap 252 an equal test for all the drivers.

In making the announcement of the race at the recent

Cayuga International Speedway awards banquet, Wayne Conroy, Track Manager, said that all of the drivers will have to make slight changes to their cars.

"Nothing very drastic will have to be changed," Conroy added

as he spoke to the more than 500 in attendance at the awards banquet. Awards were presented to the top drivers in the Red Cap points funds, the \$100,000 Export "A" Stock Car Series of Champions, and the Mini Stox division.

Jerry Makara of Westland, Michigan won the Red Cap \$5,000 Cayuga International Speedway title as well as the combined \$10,000 Cayuga - Delaware championship.

Finishing second in the Red Cap Cayuga fund was Art Clark of West Seneca, N.Y. and third was London's Earl Ross.

Second in the com-

bined Red Cap fund was Ross while Toronto's Norm Lelliott placed third.

Lelliott was also presented with his trophy for winning the \$100,000 Export "A" Stock Car Series of Champions, second place award went to Brian Settrington of Wheatley, Ontario and third to Earl Ross, the London driver won the title in 1972.

The Mini Stox division based on import sedans, was won by Randy Slack of Empire Cor's, Ontario. Second place went to Hamilton's Stan Pokupiec while third was Larry Anthony of Fisherville, Ontario.
