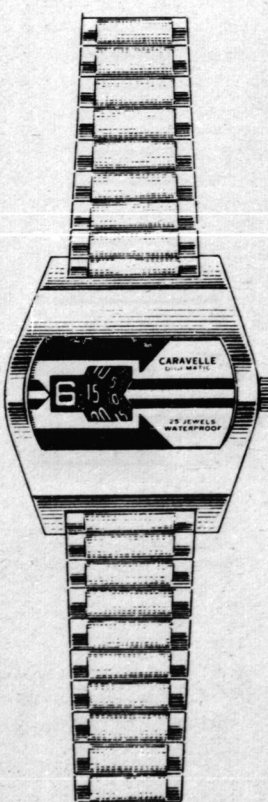

Bill Evans Runs For Area Councillor

A 52-year-old Nanticoke merchant is running for area councillor in Ward 1 (Walpole - Jarvis - Selkirk) of the City of Nanticoke in the upcoming election.

Bill Evans, married with three children, told the Record Tuesday he is very concerned about the future of the village of Nanticoke.

The provincial government is limiting residential development in the area, he said, and everybody is concerned about it. Nobody knows what it's going to be like here with Stelco,

their industrial complex, Texaco and Hydro all around. "Nanticoke has got a stake in something out here."

Mr. Evans says he likes municipal government, knows there are going to be changes

under the new regional set-up and feels his experience in municipal politics will be an asset.

For the past three years, he has served as councillor for Walpole Township. Prior to that, he worked on the

local planning board for two years and he has also been a member of the school board.

Mr. Evans is a member of the Canadian Order of Foresters, the Legion and the Anglican Church.

Albert Fledderus Runs For Regional Councillor

A 26-year-old carpenter is running for regional councillor in the City of Nanticoke.

Albert Fledderus of R. R. #1, Jarvis told the Record Tuesday he is running for the upper-tier position because "we need more young people in government."

And, he is concerned about keeping taxes down and getting better roads for Haldimand County.

Area roads are in pretty poor shape, he said, and this is one of the main things that should be looked into.

He also feels most of the votes are going to be in Norfolk and thinks

"we've got to have people over here to look after Haldimand."

Mr. Fledderus is interested in regional government as a whole. And, he felt there should be some competition at the regional level.
