Large crowds of wor-  
shippers attended both

Charman. Words of  
Welcome to all in at-  
tendance were extended  
by Clerk of Session, Mr.  
Charles Tietz.

Guest speaker for this  
important mark in  
Church history was  
Rev. Norman MacKen-  
zie, M.A., D.D., who is  
Associate Secretary for  
the Division of Mission  
in Canada. His evening  
topic was, "Long Ropes  
and Strong Stakes," in  
which he told of an ex-  
perience as a young Boy  
Scout in Northern China,  
camping one evening on  
the hillside. He stressed  
how the desert winds  
crushed the tents which  
had insufficient strength

in its ropes and stakes.

This, he said, could also  
apply to all our lives.

We MUST have large  
tents for God, with  
strong stakes which are  
planted firmly in God's  
faith, as well as having  
long ropes to support  
and lean on.

In closing he stated,  
"Faith, is like a small  
boy with a kite high up  
in the sky, so far in  
fact it cannot be seen.  
The boy knows it is there  
by the tug or quiver  
of the string in his  
hand." "Do we feel the  
tug and pull of Christ?"  
he asked.

Immediately follow-  
ing the evening service,  
a social time was held  
in the Sunday School  
Rooms, when Chairman  
of the Centennial Com-  
mittee, Mr. Arthur Win-  
ger, heartily welcomed  
all to this memorable  
occasion; also those who  
had attended the morn-  
ing service.

Greetings were  
brought from the  
Springvale Brethren-  
In-Christ Church by  
Arnold Nigh, in the ab-  
sence of his father, Rev.  
Paul Nigh. Mr. Nigh also  
complimented the con-  
gregation on their re-  
cent renovations,  
which are most attrac-  
tive. Former ministers  
and their wives were  
also present to bring  
words of praise to the  
special service. They  
were — Rev. Earl  
Brearley of Burlington,  
who is the oldest sur-  
viving former minister  
of the Springvale con-

die and go to heaven  
when they can live; and  
therefore bring heaven  
to earth?"

ings, and closed with a  
brief poem on "Kinds  
of Churches."

Mr. Winger read a

ference, as well as  
reading a telegram from  
Moderator of the United  
Church of Canada, Rev.  
Bruce MacLeod, who  
stressed his happiness,  
on behalf of the entire

R. R. 1, Hagersville,
