

**C.H. Suggests -**

**"Erie" For Region Name**

Lake Erie may give its name to the proposed region comprising Haldimand and Norfolk counties.

At a meeting in the Haldimand county administration building last Wednesday, members of the Central Haldimand Steering Committee favored the Regional Municipality of Erie label suggested by

Haldimand county clerk, Karl Benner.

Voting members (elected officials) approved recommending this title for the soon-to-be formed region to the Haldimand-Norfolk Joint Study Committee at its next meeting on regional government.

The suggested municipality of Central Haldimand includes the

town of Caledonia, the villages of Cayuga and Hagersville, and the townships of North Cayuga, South Cayuga, Oneida, Seneca and Rainham.

Among other recommendations the committee will suggest to the joint study group are:

\* The election should be conducted on a ward system the first year, with each ward consisting of the area included in the boundaries of the existing municipalities.

\* The Central Haldimand area council should have 18 representatives, largely based on representation by population.

\* Three regional representatives, the mayor and two regional councillors, should be elected at large.

**Walpole Council Meets**

At least one propane supplier in Haldimand County has hiked its prices 50 per cent in the last two months, Walpole council was told Friday night.

Sydney Marsh of R. R. 2, Nanticoke said Superior propane distributors raised their prices from 23.9 cents a gallon to 35 cents a gallon for his residence. And, the pricing for summer homes requir-

ing small quantities has jumped to 38 cents.

Mr. Marsh told council the increase occurred just prior to the release of the Ontario Energy Board's decision on Union Gas Co. Ltds.' application to discontinue service to some customers in Haldimand County.

The reconstruction of 700 feet of John Street in Hagersville will be done by R. F. Almas Co. Ltd.

Hagersville Council awarded the project to Almas' Monday night, subject to a final price and quantity check. The company submitted the lowest tender to the village for the street job.

Their bid was 33,344.20, while Cayuga Materials and Construction Ltd. sub-

mitted a tender figure of \$39,962.12.
