Another Gas Increase Requested

Union Gas Limited announced Friday it has applied to the Ontario Energy Board for permission to raise its natural gas rates, on an interim basis, by about 5 per cent.

If Union's application is approved by the Ontario board, the cost of gas to the average residential user in southwestern Ontario will increase by approxi-mately \$8 per year. This works out to an average of 65 cents

per month. The interim increase is being requested pend-ing the final decision of the OEB on an earlier equest by Union for a detailed review of its revenue requirements. This review is scheduled to begin October 30 and is expected to take

several months to com-Union's interim application is intended to recover an increase in its gas costs resulting from a September 1 mission tariffs fixed by the National Energy pitals School of Nursing Board for TransCanada PipeLines. The application is also intended to cover a further increase in TransCanada's rates expected
