

No Easy Task Pick "Town Of Haldimand" Name

Picking a name for the soon-to-be born municipality of Central Haldimand was no easy task. But, Town of Haldimand was finally chosen last Wednesday night for the area comprising Hagersville, Caledonia, Cayuga, North Cayuga, South Cayuga, Oneida, Seneca and Rainham.

At the meeting in the Haldimand County Administration Building, names were tossed onto the floor, only to be twisted, abbreviated or rejected.

At one point in the discussions, it was suggested three names be placed on the ballot for the electorate's decision. However, the

proposed Central Haldimand area ended up favoring Town of Haldimand as their recommendation to the Haldimand - Norfolk Joint Study Committee.

Other titles suggested were: Town of Haldimand Centre, Town of Haldiman (it's different and nobody pronounces the d anyways), Township of Grand Haldimand and Township of Haldimand Grand.

At their previous Wednesday meeting (Sept. 5), they chose the name of "The Regional Municipality of Erie" to recommend to the Joint Study Committee for the region of Haldimand and Norfolk Counties.

To Repair H.S.S. Roof

Hagersville Secondary School will not be getting a new roof because the cost is "almost out of the question."

At the Haldimand County Board of Education meeting Tuesday night, the Board agreed that blisters on the roof should be repaired on a unit basis.

Chairman Don Duxbury said the Board should be able to get another six or seven years out of the present roof. The blisters would be removed by the square foot at a very nominal sum compared to the cost of replacing the roof, he said.

At their July meeting, the Property Committee reported to the Board that the school needed a

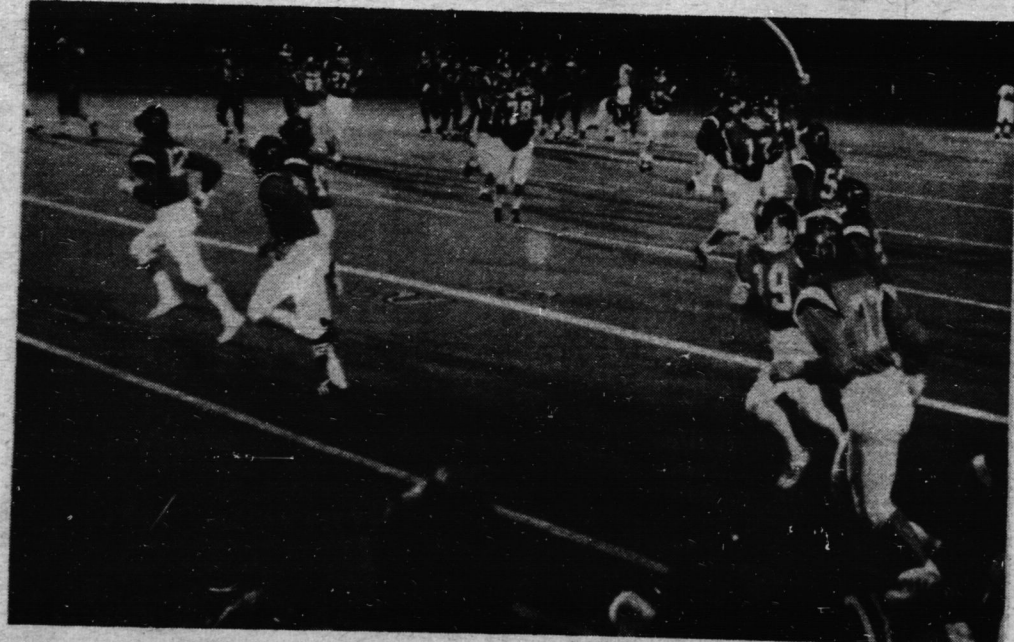
Walpole Township is in the proposed area of Nanticoke Creek, while Hagersville is in the

proposed Central Haldimand municipality.

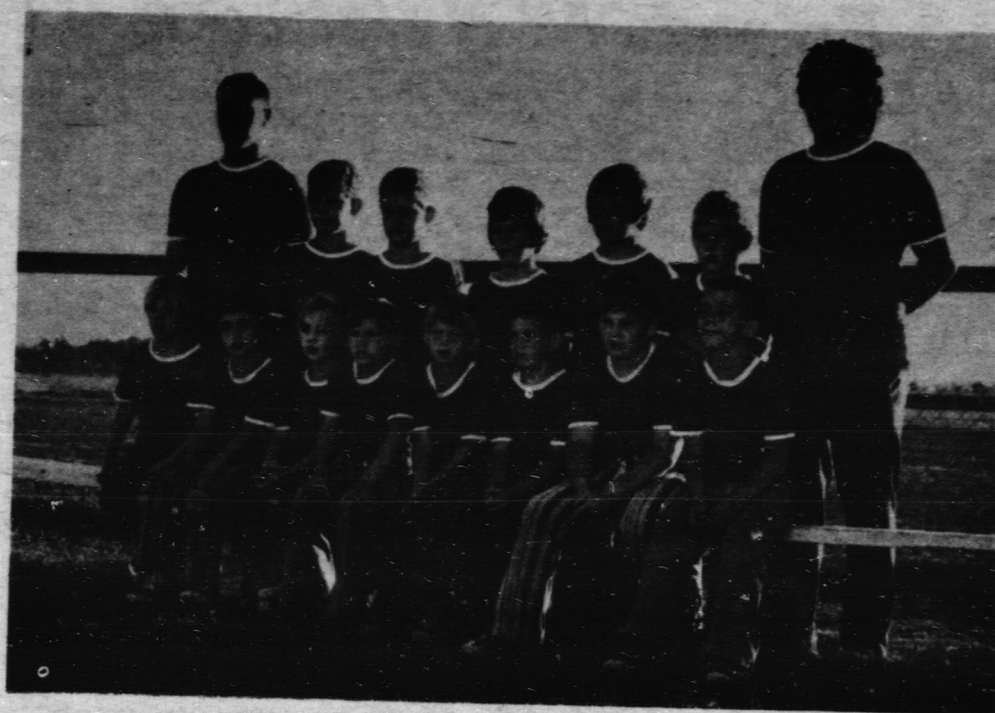
Hagersville has suggested their boundary be extended 300 feet north of lots 12-20 of Concession 11 of Walpole Twp.

Deputy-reeve Bruce Meehan told council at Monday night's council meeting he had been talking to some of the residents in the affected

Villagers Want Community Centre Maintained

Hagersville's Community Centre should not be sacrificed for a new fire hall.

That was the message Hagersville councillors got "loud and clear" at a public meeting attended by approximately 100 people last Thursday night.

Village residents agreed Hagersville should have a better fire hall, but not at the expense of the community centre.

The meeting, called by council, was to determine public feeling on the idea of renovating the community centre into a fire hall.

This suggestion, originally brought to council by Fran Almas, was endorsed at a

later meeting by Fire Chief Bill McClarty and a delegation of volunteer firemen.

Mr. McClarty told the

meeting Thursday the firemen are paid \$100 a year to fight all fires. They sometimes have to

Selkirk Trustees Lean To Walpole

Selkirk wants to go with Nanticoke Creek, the Municipality of Central Haldimand was told at last Wednesday night's meeting. But, they approved a motion recommending the police village be included in their proposed municipality.

The village is presently located on the boundary of Rainham Twp. (Central Haldimand) and Walpole Twp. (Nanticoke Creek). Blake Gloyd, reeve of

Rainham, reported at the meeting in the Haldimand County Administration Building that a referendum was held in the village and a slight majority of those who voted, favored going west (Walpole).

However, Mr. Gloyd made a resolution on behalf of Rainham twp. that the village be included in Central Haldimand because Nanticoke Creek will be experiencing growth.

3 Killed Identified

Three people who were killed in an accident near Jarvis last Wednesday morning were identified Wednesday afternoon and Thursday.

Darrell Bruce Schweyer, 18, of 319 St. Patrick Street, Port Dover, Rocky Mitchell, 21, of 3 Toulon Rd., Scarborough and Stanford St. Croix, 45, of R. R. 4, Waterford were killed in a collision at the intersection of Concession 4 of Walpole Township and the Nanticoke Sideroad. Identification was hampered because all three were badly burned.

According to Cayuga O.P.P., Mr. Schweyer was eastbound, driving a '65 Meteor, and Mr. Mitchell was southbound on the Nanticoke Road, driving a '72 Plymouth, when they were in collision. Mr. St. Croix was a passenger in the Mitchell car, which burst into flames after the crash.

Constable George Miller of the Cayuga detachment investigated.
