A Look At Business Jarvis Antiques

Collecting old ornate furniture, books yellowed with age, grandmother's canning jars and fine old china is the "coming thing" with today's generation.

And, they're becoming harder to buy as the interest in preserving and restoring treasures from the past grows in popularity.

The business of selling antiques will increase because young people are buying old things to furnish their homes, says Mrs. M. Grace. She moved to Jarvis from Port Dover three years ago and brought her love of antiques with her.

Mrs. Grace bought a 19th century Talbot Street building from Alex Duncan, a well

known area man, and opened Jarvis' Antique Shop. Her interest in old furniture and dishes was not newly acquired. "I've always been selling antiques," Mrs. Grace told the Record. In Port Dover, she sold furniture from her historic 155-year-old home.

Mrs. Grace's shop is filled with thousands of old articles which she has picked up at auction sales or someone has brought in to her shop privately. But, she would still like more items. Antiques are becoming more difficult to buy because there are too many people in the business, she explained.

Mrs. Grace says she enjoys living in Jarvis, like the people and

handles as much business as she is capable of. However, she expects to be twice as busy next year, with more people moving into the area due to industrial development at Nanticoke. And, she is looking forward to it.

The building which houses all her treasures is an "antique" in itself. It was built as a hardware and tinsmith shop after Jarvis' great fire of 1873 destroyed the previous shop.

In the early 1900's, R. A. McCarter operated an implement and hardware shop there.

Then in 1923, Alex Duncan moved from his farm into town and began working for Mr. McCarter, his father-in-law. He was married to the late Louella McCarter. He became sole owner of the farm machinery dealership in 1950 when Mr. McCarter passed away.

In 1970, Mr. Duncan and his wife, Lea sold the building to Mrs. Grace. She installed living quarters and brought her antiques to the store front.

Now, the shop is a browser's paradise for people living in the area or just passing through.

OBITUARY

Mrs. Gordon Miller
 During the months of illness leading to her death on September 10, 1973 in St. Joseph's Hospital, Hamilton, Mrs. Gordon Miller showed remarkable courage and fortitude, maintaining in spite of increasing difficulties, the close, warm friendly family ties which had characterized their life together, Gordon, Reta, and the four sons, Barry, Doug, Glen and Allan.

Reta Mae Johnson, born July 29, 1926 in Norwich, Ontario, lived a well-fulfilled and interesting life. Daughter of Vincent (Bob) Johnson of Tillsonburg and the late Vida (Fleming) Johnson, Reta received her schooling mainly in Norwich. Because her father was employed on the C. N. Railway as an agent, it meant the family moved frequently. During her school years, Reta attended in 1950 when Mr. McCarter passed away.

In 1944, 1945 saw the young lady entering nurses training at Victoria Hospital, London, earning her "Reg. N." in 1948. After working in the office of Dr. Copeman in Simcoe for several months, Reta became the wife of Gordon Miller, May 28, 1949, residing in their farm home just north of Jarvis.

During the years, Mrs. Miller helped organize the West Haldimand Hospital Auxiliary in Hagersville, the Knox, Jarvis Couples Club of which she and Gordon were past-presidents in 1953. Surviving Reta Miller are her father, Bob Johnson at Tillsonburg; brother Glen of Mississauga; husband, Gordon (present reeve of Walpole Twp., an elder in Knox Church) and the four sons, Barry, Douglas, Glen and Allan.

One of the remarkable notes made during the memorial for Mrs. Miller in Knox Church, on September 13 at 2 p.m., was that the material used had all been meticulously selected by Reta herself during the months of preparing herself and her family and friends for the day which doctors had warned her was not very far ahead.

The two selections of poetry from the inspirational book, Leaves of Gold, one, The Watcher, from page 85, the other, Because you love me from page 77, the three sacred songs - Unto the Hills, Bless Be the Tie

and Rejoice, the Lord is King; the list of Scriptures emphasizing the christian hope in the face of death, all of it suggested that this courageous lady must surely have been planning that those surviving her would be encouraged to be strong and of a good courage as well.

Accompanying Knox minister, Granville Taylor-Munro in the pulpit for the service on September 13, 1973 was Peter Brouwer, minister of Ebenezer Church, Jarvis. Mr. Brouwer had been frequently at St. Joseph's Hospital to provide pastoral care to members of the local Christian Reformed parish and always made a point of looking in briefly on one of the friends and neighbours from the Presbyterian Parish, Reta Miller.
