Region Hiring Continues

The task of hiring employees for the new Regional Municipality of Haldimand - Norfolk is by no means finished.

At last Thursday's regular meeting, council approved:

Robert Healey be engaged as Regional Water and Sewer Eng-

ineer at a salary of \$21,000 per year. Allan May be engaged as Regional Waste Disposal Supervisor.

Elroy Thompson and Elmer McConnell be appointed Weed Inspectors for the Region at \$3 per hour plus 15 cents per mile. Treasurer Charles

Douglas be authorized to advertise for an Intermediate Accountant and a Clerk-receptionist.

The Director of Planning and Development be authorized to advertise for a plumbing inspector for the former county of Haldimand (continued on page 5)

Jarvis Youth Hits Church

A 20-year-old Jarvis youth ran into St. Paul's Anglican Church Sunday morningwith his car.

According to Cayuga O.P.P. investigating officer, Bob Adams, Marvin Higgins of 14 Monson St. was west-

bound on Highway 3 and attempting to pass a car on the right. He swerved left to avoid collision with the lead vehicle when his car skidded out of control and into the Anglican Church.

Mr. Higgins escaped injury. Damage to his car was estimated at \$1,000.

Rev. Douglas Perry of St. Paul's told the Record parishoners were arriving at the church and children getting out of Sunday school at the time of and after the accident. Services went on as usual.

He said there was no serious damage to the church, just some chipping of brick.

The car hit the church east of the front door and wedged between the church and a pole.

Regional Councillors Approve \$6,500 For Nine Month Term

Haldimand - Norfolk regional councillors set their salaries for their nine month term beginning April 1st at \$6,500 last Thursday.

The recommendation, brought in by Finance and Administration Chairman Fred Peacock was accepted by regional council after considerable deliberation.

Following introduction of the suggestion, councillor Robert Causyn and Clare

Huffman moved council go into Committee of the Whole to discuss the salary issue further. The press was barred from the room for an hour.

The 1974 rate was kept at \$6,500.

According to Bill 190, "members of the Regional Council, other than the chairman, may be paid for services performed on and after the 1st day of April, 1974 such annual and other remuneration as the

Regional Council may determine".

\$6,500 computed at a per annum rate would give councillors a salary of \$8,666.

Regional councillors will also receive a salary from the area council they serve on when remuneration is set.

Councillors approved a penalty of \$50 per meeting be imposed on councillors who are absent from more than five council and/or committee meetings.
