## Federation News

By Otto Crone  
Haldimand and  
Norfolk county councils  
are to be commended  
for having carried out  
the wolf bounty program  
this past winter. Hope-  
fully the new regional  
government will carry  
on this program until  
the province sees fit  
to re-implement it on  
a provincial basis as it  
should be.

Compensation paid  
for animals killed by  
wolves at market value  
may seem fair to people  
not involved in farming,  
but they are nearly  
always animals that are  
newborn and were not  
for sale. Farmers are  
still being denied the  
profit that would be  
possible if they grew up.  
In one six month period  
of the Ministry of Nat-  
ural Resources tabled  
confirmed wolf kills,

400 sheep, 34 cattle, five  
pigs and three fowl were  
killed. That is a lot of  
livestock that was des-  
troyed without having a  
chance to grow up and  
provide food and profit  
for people.

Most of the critics  
of the wolf bounty have  
developed their opinions  
on a study done by a  
naturalist for a five  
summer month period  
in the barren arctic  
above the tree line  
where mice were plenti-  
ful and easy to catch,  
but says nothing about  
how they feed in winter  
when the ground is  
frozen and covered with  
snow.

Livestock producers  
are already very  
discouraged with con-  
ditions in the industry  
and do not need the added  
worry of an increase in  
wolf population.

## Heart Fund Final Report

Heart Fund receipts  
for 1974 have been  
audited by Miss Pat  
Petracca and show a  
total of \$2,387.00 for  
the Hagersville and  
Springvale area. 86%  
of this money collected  
will be spent on  
research in Ontario  
next year. Last year's  
initial campaign total-  
led \$1,383.00.

The following team  
captains, Mrs. E. Mont-  
ague, Mrs. M. King, Mr.  
L. Skrabba, Jr., Mrs. J.  
Coyne and Mrs. O.  
Crone of Springvale  
are grateful to all the  
canvassers for their  
help and to all who gave  
donations. The two top  
canvassers for bringing  
in the largest amounts  
were Mrs. R. Nelson  
and Mr. A. Zdunich.

Group donations were  
received from the  
Knights of Columbus,  
The Hagersville Legion  
and Auxiliary, Garnet  
United Church Women,  
The Forward Rebekah  
Lodge, Jarvis Lions  
Club, The Catholic  
Women's League of  
Hagersville and  
Walpole.

The contributions  
received are a form of  
investment and security  
that something is being  
done to focus on the  
heart and the fact that  
heart disease is an  
epidemic. Heart re-  
search has reduced the  
grim statistics and will  
continue to do so when  
communities like ours  
give support to this  
yearly campaign.
