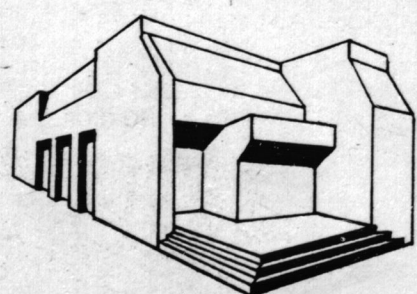

## History Of Hagersville

### THE HAGERSVILLE BAPTIST CHURCH

Early Baptist meetings were held for the parishoners of Hagersville in a room over Fisher's store. With Mr. Barton Quider as contractor, the present Regular Baptist church was built in 1883, and Mr. Fisher's rooms were abandoned.

The first charter members of the church were: Mr. and Mrs. A.W. Thompson, Mr. and Mrs. James Greenbury, Mr. and Mrs. David Spears, Mr. and Mrs. Hiram Wardell, Mr. and Mrs. Barton Quider, Mr. and Mrs. William R. Hobbs, Mrs. Dan Forsythe, Mr. John Burke, Mrs. John Lewis and D.A. Messacar.

In 1922 the building was altered, the baptistry changed, a stained glass window installed, and the tower built at the front. In 1933 the horse sheds were torn down and the material used to build a room at the back of the church for general meetings. The annual Church Supper was held in this room for the first time on January 26, 1934.

The electric organ was presented to the church at the celebration of its Golden Jubilee in 1933, by the Russell family, and in 1947 the young people of the church equipped the kitchen with sink and cupboards.

The Deed of the land for the church, as is common for those days lists the doctrinal beliefs to be held by the members and the form of administration needed.

The absence of a regular minister in the 1880's brought to the parish a group of students who alternated conducting the services

until the arrival of a regular minister for the congregation.

There have been a great number of regular pastors who have served the church for over eighty years including:
