The decision gives area councillors \$6,500, regional councillors in Nanticoke \$13,000 and the mayor \$15,000. Dear Editor and Staff: Taxpayers must pay \$86,500 for the mayor and As I have just sent in my councillor salaries in Nanticoke alone - not even allowing last report as Public for the regional figure.
