

Harvesters Pound Caledonia 12-5

The Jarvis Harvesters travelled to Caledonia for a rematch on Monday night and picked up some revenge for the 6-2 loss at home on Saturday.

The Harvesters pounded out 13 hits with three of them being home runs. Ted Phibbs showed the way with two home runs; one of them right out onto the road in Mount Hope. This is where the Caledonia team is playing their home games till their new set of flood lights are ready. Phibbs also hit a double and scored three runs for a good nights work as well as handling five chances in the infield.

Jarvis wasted little time in getting on the scoreboard as they scored in the first inning. Hub Fehrman walked with one out. Bill Prince lined a single to centre field and when the fielder threw to third to get Hub the ball went loose and Hub scored. A single by Don Smith and two errors gave the Caledonia team a run in the bottom of the first. In the second inning winning pitcher Darryl

Fehrman gave up a single to G. Smith and then Dave Allison cracked a homerun. Hub Fehrman tried to help

his kid brother out in the third inning by hitting a homerun with no one on base.

In the top of the fourth

the Harvesters pulled even when Ted Phibbs led off with a double. Ken Graham followed with a single. Bruce

Biggar followed with a hit but a good throw nipped Graham trying to score.

Caledonia made it 4-4 in the last of the fourth when Darryl hit Guyat and Joe Timson came through with a single. With runners at second and third a ball got by the catcher allowing one run to score. This was the last run Caledonia would get till the last of the 9th when two singles and an error let Dave Marsden score the final run.

This is the first time this year that Darryl has gone the distance and it could not come at a better time as the Harvesters will start their

playoffs the first week in August. Fehrman struck out ten and walked two. Jarvis took the lead for good in the sixth when Graham singled and Marve Fehrman and Biggar walked to fill the bases.

Edwards came on to put out the fire but Darryl won his own game with a single.

Bryan Smith then hit a double to score two more. Phibbs hit his solo home run in the 7th and then hit a three run shot in the 8th to account for an 11 to 4 lead. Singles by Biggar, Craddock and Smith gave Jarvis the final run in the top of the 9th.

Harvesters Split Games With Caledonia

The Jarvis Harvesters split the two games played last week with the Caledonia Fairfield Glass team winning 12-5 and losing 6-2.

On Saturday night Johnny Edwards, a former Jarvis hurler led the Caledonia team into Jarvis and went home with a 6-2 win.

Edwards was not the great knockout performer that he was in the '60's but still rates as one of the best pitchers in the Tri-County league. Edwards

was touched for nine hits, four walks while striking out six.

The Harvesters scored a run in the first inning when Dennis Craddock walked and then stole second and third.

Bryan Smith singled to score Dennis for the first run. In the third inning Smith picked up his second hit of the game and promptly stole second. Bill Prince flew out and Fred McKeen struck out

before Paul Kett came through with a single to give Jarvis a 2-0 lead.

Hub Fehrman was throwing great ball and looked like he was in complete control fanning seven and walking only one for the first six innings. Only Johnny Edwards had picked up two hits and Smith had one before Hub seemed to tire in the seventh.

Guyat led off with a double and Smith walked. Edwards got his third hit of the game to score Guyat and when Smith tried to score on the hit Bryan Smith threw a strike to Paul Kett catching and he was out.

Caledonia added a run in the eighth on a hit and two errors. The Fairfield Glass team broke the game wide open in the 9th with four runs. Hub took himself out of the game and brother Marve came on but he was touched for five hits good for four runs and the ball game. Bruce Biggar and Smith were the only players for Jarvis to get two hits, with singles going to Craddock, Prince, Kett, Hub Fehrman and Ken Graham.

If Nie can continue to pitch this well it should give coach Nat Salvatore a big boost for the upcoming playoffs.
