BY-LAW NO. 60-74
A BY-LAW TO REGULATE THE LOCATION OF BUILDINGS, STRUCTURES AND TREES ON LANDS ADJACENT TO CERTAIN REGIONAL ROADS, AND TO REPEAL BY-LAW NO. 48-74
WHEREAS Section 39 of an Act to amend The Regional Municipality of Haldimand-Norfolk Act, Statutes of Ontario, 1973, Chapter 155, confers upon the Regional Corporation all the powers of the Highway Improvement Act with respect to roads in the Regional Roads system.
AND WHEREAS Section 60, The Highway Improvement Act, R.S.O. 1970, Chapter 201 authorizes the application of Section 35 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1970, Chapter 349 to the Region;
AND WHEREAS it is deemed to be necessary and desirable to regulate the location of buildings, structures and trees on lands adjacent to certain Regional Roads;
THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Regional Municipality of Haldimand-Norfolk enacts as follows:
1. This By-Law shall apply to all lands lying within a distance of 150 feet from the limits of all the Regional Roads in the Regional Municipality of Haldimand-Norfolk, except:
(a) Regional Road No. 22 in the former Township of Moutton.
(b) That portion of Regional Road No. 11 in the former Township of Dunn, which extends southerly from the southerly limit of the Road between Concessions 3 and 4, adjacent to the westerly bank of the Grand River in the Naval Reserve.
(c) That portion of Regional Road No. 11 in the former Township of Dunn, which extends northerly from the northerly limit of the road between Concessions 3 and 4, along and adjacent to the westerly bank of the Grand River.
(d) That part of Regional Road No. 38 within the limits of the Village of Courtland, Registered Plan 14B.
(e) That part of Regional Road No. 2 within the limits of the Village of LaSalette, Registered Plan 52B.
(f) Those Regional Roads within the limits of the Village of Windham Centre, Registered Plan 48B.
(g) Those Regional Roads within the limits of the Village of Villa Nova, Registered Plan 41B.
(h) Those Regional Roads within the limits of the Village of Windham Centre, Registered Plan 42B.
(i) That part of Regional Road No. 15 within the limits of the Village of Vittoria.
(j) That part of Regional Road No. 42 within the limits of the Hamlet of Port Royal.
(k) That part of Regional Road No. 21 within the limits of the Hamlet of Wycombe, Registered Plan 26B.
(l) Those Regional Roads within the limits of the Village of St. Williams, Registered Plan 32B.
(m) That part of Regional Road No. 42 within the limits of the Village of Clear Creek, Registered Plan 28B.
(n) Those Regional Roads within the Village of Houghton Centre, Registered Plan 27B.
(o) That part of Regional Road No. 17 from Highway No. 3 southerly to the southerly limits of Registered Plan 397 and Registered Plan 475, (Former County of Norfolk.)
(p) That part of Regional Road No. 16 within the limits of the Village of Silver Hill, Registered Plan 60B.
(q) That part of Regional Road No. 10 within the limits of the Village of Walsh, Registered Plan 34B.

(r) That part of Regional Road No. 10 south of the northerly limits of Registered Plan 346 and Registered Plan 128, to the Lake Shore Road. (Turkey Point)
(s) That part of Regional Road No. 12 within the limits of the Village of Port Ryerse, Registered Plan 17B.
(t) That part of Regional Road No. 4 from the easterly limit of the Town of Delhi to where the westerly limit of the Brantford Road intersects the northerly limit of the allowance for road between Concession XI-XII in the former Township of Windham, as shown on Registered Plan 45B.
(u) That part of Regional Road No. 4 within the limits of the Village of Vanessa, Registered Plan 49B.
(v) Those Regional Roads within the limits of the Village of Boston, Registered Plan 45B.
(w) That part of Regional Road No. 5 within the limits of the Village of Delhi, Registered Plan 39A-39B.
(x) That part of Regional Road No. 7 within the limits of the Village of Nixon, Registered Plan 54B.
(y) That part of Regional Road No. 8 within the limits of the Village of Teeterville, Registered Plan 47B.
(z) That part of Regional Road within the limits of the Village of Beaton, Registered Plan 44B.
(aa) That part of Regional Road No. 21 within the limits of the Village of Lynedoch, Registered Plan 37B.
(ab) Regional Road No. 8, (Former County of Norfolk.)
(ac) Those Regional Roads which lie within the Municipal boundaries of the following former Municipalities as they existed on March 31st, 1974: Town of Caledonia, Village of Hagersville, Village of Jarvis, Village of Cayuga, Town of Simcoe, Town of Delhi, Town of Port Dover, Town of Waterford and Village of Port Rowan.
(ad) Those Regional Roads which are within the Municipal boundaries of the former Town of Dunnville as it existed on March 31st, 1974.
2. No person shall erect any building or structure within 150 feet of any Regional Road to which this By-Law applies, without first obtaining a permit from the Regional Engineering office.
3. No person shall erect any building or structure, any part of which is located closer to the nearest limit of any Regional Road to which this By-Law applies, than 57 feet where the road is 86 feet wide, 57 feet where the road is 66 feet wide, and in no case closer to the centre line of the existing road than 100 feet; SAVE THAT:
(a) If the building or structure is to be erected within 50 feet of an existing building and such existing building is 10 feet or more closer to the nearest limit of a Regional Road than the distance above prescribed, then such building or structure may be erected 10 feet closer to the nearest Regional Road than the distance above prescribed;
(b) One addition may be made to an existing building provided that:
(i) Such addition does not increase the floor area of the building as it existed at the date of the passing of this by-law by more than 25%.
(ii) It is not erected closer to the nearest Regional Road than such existing building.
(iii) In the event that the owner wishes to increase his building by more than 25% the Regional right-of-way of 50 feet from the centre line must be met.
4. (1) No person shall erect any building or structure on the lands covered by this By-Law without providing:
(a) The following off-street parking:
RESIDENTIAL
One off-street parking space, 10 feet by 20 feet for each dwelling unit.
COMMERCIAL
One off-street parking space 10 feet by 20 feet for each 200 square feet of ground floor area in a commercial building.
INDUSTRIAL
One off-street parking space 10 feet by 20 feet for each five employees working in an industrial building.
(2) The following off-street loading facilities for all commercial buildings exceeding 3,000 square feet floor area and for all industrial buildings.
One loading space 12 feet by 50 feet with a minimum height of 14 feet for each 40,000 square feet or part thereof of the floor area of any industrial or commercial building.
(3) The provisions of this section shall not apply to the erection of an addition under Section 3 (b) above.
5. No person shall plant any deciduous or coniferous tree within 50 feet of the centre line of all Regional Roads to which this by-law applies.
6. Any person convicted of a breach of any provision of this By-Law shall forfeit and pay, at the discretion of the convicting Magistrate, a penalty not exceeding the sum of \$300.00 for each offence, exclusive of costs. The imposition of a penalty for any violation of this By-Law shall not excuse the violation or permit it to continue.
7. By-Law No. 48-74 is hereby repealed.
8. This By-Law shall come into effect upon the day that it is passed by Council, subject to the approval of the Ontario Municipal Board.
This By-Law read a First, Second and Third time and finally passed this 26th day of September, 1974.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

By-Law No. 60-74 was passed for the purpose of preventing buildings being constructed or enlarged adjacent to a Regional Road, in such a manner that it will present a problem for the property owner and the Region in future Road Widening.

Nanticoke Dog Rates

about the proposed rate structure.
He explained some feel the city is discriminating against those who enjoy a dog as a pet when cats and other pets are not licenced and allowed to run at large.
To some people \$20 may not be too much, he commented, but to others who live alone or have families and really enjoy the companionship of dogs, you're putting a real burden on them.
Councillor George Dmetriuc favored the rate structure, pointing out the cost for one dog is \$4 and if a person wants to get into the dog business, they should pay for it.
In November we approved a \$700 expenditure for compensation for livestock killings and we spend \$5500 a month for pound control, he said.
Councillor Bill Buck of Woodhouse was in favor of the fees if it would help keep taxes down. "I think more things in this city should be paid by individuals who want them," he said.
Councillor John Roxburgh felt there should be a difference in the rate for a male and spayed bitch since a male can help increase the dog population while the spayed female cannot.
Councillor Jim Davidson of Jarvis said he also supported the by-law 100 per cent and cited a recent account of a village resident being bitten by a wandering dog. He wondered if the figures shouldn't be higher to cut down on 3rd and 4th dogs.
Councillor Phil Hare of Walpole also agreed with the new structure.
There is no way a \$2 fee would cover the higher cost of collection this year, he said.
Any person who does not pay his dog licence fee on demand within 30 days of the demand will be required to pay an additional fee of \$10 for each dog he may own, possess or harbour.

Councillor Shay asked Mr. White if there would be land available in the city site for the region's Administration Complex.
Mr. White consented and commented it would give some impulse to the area.
Councillor Gordon Miller asked Mr. White if agricultural land in the Townsend site would be used for agriculture until it's needed.
The minister said yes and Queen's Park hopes to keep the very best land in food production forever as a green belt.
He also commented that while the official soil maps show land in the South Cayuga area to be Class 2 land, experts say it is poor class 2 land and Class 5.
