## Brief Says Norfolk Needs Expanded College Programs

A recently released brief prepared by The Norfolk Needs Study Committee states there is an immediate need for expansion of Fanshawe College programs in the Lake Erie Area.

The Study Committee made up of representatives from industries currently in the Area, new industries that will move into the area, representatives from Canada Manpower, Fanshawe College Area Advisory Committee and other interested citizens, has been holding exploratory meetings in Simcoe since last February. Committee Chairman is Denis Rogerson of Simcoe.

The brief takes note of a Canada Manpower survey of trained manpower needs for new industries in the region. The survey shows that by 1976 there will be a requirement of a construction force of 9,400 and that within 25 years 61,000 new jobs may be created in the industrial area of Nanticoke city. An expanded Fanshawe College program would provide job training and courses related to the immediate needs of both construction and service industries.

Beyond the initial stages of expansion, the community will demand opportunities for post-secondary education. High school graduates will want the option of further education within their local community. Many adults coming to the area will expect programs to be available in humanities, arts and living skills.

**Draw Winner**  
 The draw winner of the beautiful ceramic Christmas tree, held by the Hagersville Kinetite Club at their recent bazaar, was Mrs. Pat Snider of Fisherville.

In the area Fanshawe now offers a Farm Business Management program, adult training courses in co-operation with Canada Manpower and a variety of continuing education courses for adults attracting a current enrollment of 2,000.

Additional Fanshawe College programs in technology, applied arts, business, health and welfare, and nursing education would be required to serve the anticipated needs of the area. A Resources Management and Land Use Planning program is seen as an early requirement to train people to speak and act more effectively and purposefully regarding their own resources in a evolution from a

traditionally rural environment to one of increased industrial activity. Minimum new facilities considered necessary for expansion of the Fanshawe programs would be six acres for a campus area with 20,000 square feet of space for classrooms, shops, laboratories and administration offices plus equipment for shops and laboratories.

The committee's schedule for the expansion calls for adult retraining programs and part-time courses to begin immediately with the Resource Management and Land Use Planning program and other full-time post-secondary programs to begin in September 1975.
