Several attractive banners were displayed, which had been made and taken to Brantford Wesley United Church in October.

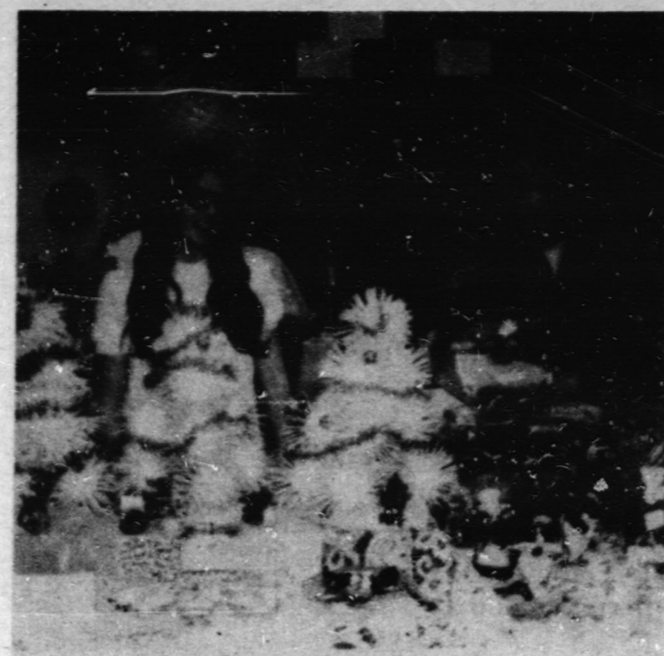
Our group was asked to plan a 3-5 minute presentation at the Christmas Festival on Sunday afternoon, December 15th.
