**Dave Smith Scores Winner
For Hagersville Juveniles**

Dave Smith scored the winning goal for the Hagersville Juveniles in their thrilling 2-1 win over Six Nations on Sunday. It was a great come from behind win for the home team in a rough hard hitting but cleanly played hockey game. Only 10 penalties were called with Six Nations

picking up six of them. Greg Fraser was tagged with a ten minute misconduct in the first period for the only major of the game. Both teams played through a scoreless first period as Hagersville picked up two minor penalties and the visitors one. Bill Downey in goal for the

home team came up with several key saves as did Greg General at the opposite end of the rink. Hagersville had the better of the second period, but could not get the puck past General. They held a two man advantage for nearly two minutes as Six Nations sat out three of the four penalties in the second frame. With four minutes gone in the last period, Greg Fraser scored the first goal of the game. Mike Hill got control of the puck and slid it out in front of the net. Fraser pounced on it and shoved it by Downey while everyone stood around looking for it.

It took Hagersville just two minutes to get back in the game. Dave Smith, who had to be the best man on the ice for the home team, carried the puck into the visitors end. When he was knocked to the ice he took a defenceman and the goalie with him. Danny Donato got a hold of the puck, but shot it wide. Fraser Gibson

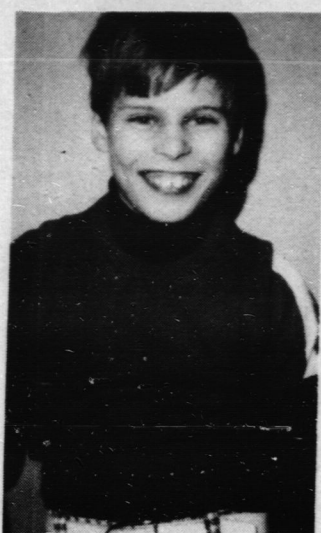

Lucas got his second of the night after the third try when the defence just wouldn't clear the puck.

It seems strange to write that Nicky Opersko picked up a shutout for Waterford as it seemed all the action was at the opposite end of the ice.
