Oldest County Inhabitants Occupy Grand River Estate

The remains of the oldest men in Haldimand county lie in a bushel basket in the home of Dr. David Marshall situated on the northern outskirts of the village of Cayuga. The Marshalls discovered the cache of bones four years ago while horseback riding on their 36-acre estate flanking the Grand River. Mrs. Marshall said they saw a bone protruding from the soil. Stopping to investigate they discovered further bones only a few inches beneath the surface. Total excavation of the site brought to light the five skulls and numerous parts of their skeletons. Also discovered was a gold ring. The discovery brought the Marshalls to the attention of archaeology interests following an article in the Hamilton Spectator and numerous enquiries from universities. "Two students from McMaster who were working on their doctorates came to dig," said Mrs. Marshall. "They left with a few bones." Following this experience, the Marshalls were concerned other persons might dig and take artifacts when they were away from home.

else has been discovered save a few pieces of pottery. From the information gleaned from history records, the Marshalls learned that the owners of the skulls walked the banks of the Grand River three to four hundred years ago. From the extensive reading of Dr. Marshall and his own experience as a doctor, Mrs. Marshall said the teeth of the skeletons are those of "meat-eaters." If the Indians had had a "grass-based" diet, decomposition of the teeth would have been greater advanced. By the absence of personal belongings save for the gold ring, it may be deduced the skeletons were Indians of little importance. This is in marked contrast to the Indian chief who was found years ago in the sand dunes of Port Maitland. The persons who uncovered it said the Indian was distinguished by the number of tools, weapons and personal belongings found in the grave. The Indians believe these would assist the dead person in the next world. All of these graves including that of a child's, also found in the sands of Port Maitland give indication these were members of the Huron nation of the Erie tribe who lived along the north side of Lake Erie. Along with the rest of the nation, this tribe was wiped out by the Iroquois during the British - French colonial wars. The skulls are a topic of conversation to the Marshalls. Besides, how many families do you know who have five human skulls in their drawing room? The Marshalls have four children for which the skulls are a novelty. The children have taken them to school from time to time, said Mrs. Marshall, "and brag as children will do." The family hopes to do future digs. Whether they discover additional skeletons or not, they have living in their house five of the oldest inhabitants of the county. -Dunnville Chronicle
