time of Confederation.

Miss Frances Law read a brief history of Norfolk.

The prayers were read from the Rev. S.J. MacDonald of the Simcoe St. Mary's Church and by Rev. Granville Taylor - Munro of Jarvis.

The names of new officers and their locality in H - N were read and talked over.

The agenda of the inauguration meeting was discussed in detail.

Greetings from the province were brought by the retiring Lieut. Governor of Ontario, the veteran Hon. W. Ross Macdonald of Brantford. Remarks by Hon. John White, Mr. John McCombs and Arthur K. Meen M.P.P. were also discussed. Mrs. Herman Fess read the brief history of Haldimand County. The interim Bylaws were read.

The President dedicated the offering and read these words in closing -

"New times demand new measures and new men.

Made wiser by the steady growth of truth.

Christ Church Holds Annual Vestry

William C. Evans was elected People's Warden at the Annual Vestry meeting of Christ Church, Nanticoke on Sunday January 27. The Rector, the Rev. R. D. Perry appointed Russell F. Weaver as his Warden.

The congregation elected W. J. Hamilton as their delegate to the Synod of Niagara and Mrs. Mary Weaver as alternate. A letter from Bishop Bothwell underlined the responsibilities of these elected

officials to play their part in the re-organized Deanery Councils. Haldimand Deanery will meet with the new Hamilton West Deanery at a special meeting in Ancaster on March 12. W. J. Snowden, the

retiring warden, presented a satisfactory financial report. A budget was adopted, accepting an increase in stipend payments and in Mission giving as well as providing for regular maintenance on the Rectory.

In his report the Rector urged the congregation to make plans to respond to rapid changes in the community because of the industrial development. Mrs. Nora Evans was made chairman of the Parish Centennial committee that will be making plans for the observance of the 100th anniversary of the setting up of the diocese of Niagara in 1875.

After a delicious dinner, a social hour

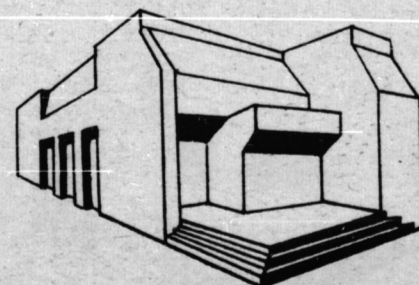
followed and all wished Mrs. Eadie a long and happy retirement.
