 Currently, the Ontario Federation of Agriculture is bringing every possible pressure to bear on the Federal government in order to bring crude oil to Montreal from Western Canada.  
 The Haldimand Federation has sent the following letter to Prime Minister Trudeau, Donald Macdonald, Minister of Energy, Mines and Resources, and Eugene Whelan Minister of Agriculture as well as our local MPs in order to impress upon them our opinion in this matter.  
 To the Honourable the Prime Minister of Canada:  
 We wish to draw your attention to our concern about the proposed alignment of the pipeline required to bring crude oil to Montreal from Western Canada. It is our opinion that this pipeline should be moved north to run from Sault Ste. Marie, crossing the Ottawa River near Chalk River and thence to Montreal. As farmers in the Haldimand area we will not support and will resist the construction of a pipeline from Sarnia to Montreal through, in many places, Class I and II farm lands.  
 We sincerely hope you will consider the serious effects this decision will have on the rich farmlands of southern Ontario and reconsider your decision in this matter.
