

# Flyers Sweep Series With Ancaster

The Hagersville Flyers advance into the next round of league playoffs against either Port Dover or Delhi, after knocking off Ancaster in three straight games.

All three games were played in Hagersville as Ancaster was unable to get ice at home. It seems the figure skating club in Ancaster would not give up an hour's ice time to help the team out. It is wonderful that the people in town can get along like they do in order that the Flyers were insured ice time for the playoffs.

Game one saw Hagersville come up with a 5-3 win in their best showing of the three games. The Flyers came out like they wanted this game and had a 3-0 lead before the period was six minutes old.

Bill Winkworth scored the first goal after taking a pass from Paul Fryett. A minute later Paul Townsend scored when he was set up by Steve Otterman and Paul McCarthy. Glen Hewson then made

icipality in the City of Nanticoke will be given the opportunity to submit a brief to council regarding future business. February 21st is the deadline. The same applies to local solicitors.

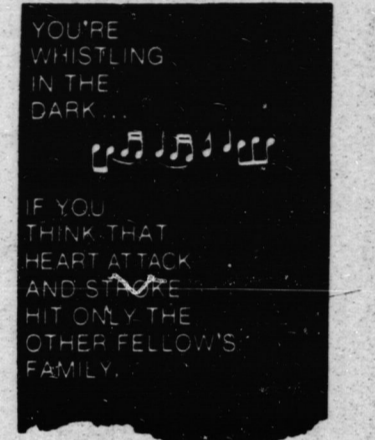
\* Council received a Protective Services report as information.
