H.S.S. Teacher Met Indian Leaders

Book reports and four days of study in Sudbury preceded the cross-country trip which ended at Alert Bay on Cormorant Island, just off the northern tip of Vancouver Island.

In between the two points, Huron, Iroquois, Ojibwa, Cree, Assin-

boine, Salish, Noolka and Kwakwuth groups were visited.

One of the highlights of the adventure for Mrs. Vardy was sleeping in teepees (birch bark and canvas) at Stony. In the evening, one member told Indian folklore in the Stony language while another translated.

She was also impressed with some of the programs, Friendship Centres and excellence of native leadership encountered.

Indians have to be educated to help themselves and this is who we were meeting, she said - Indian leaders helping the Indian situation.

Natives make marvelous leaders and they don't need degrees to do it. "They just seem to draw people....." she continued.

"I like Indians. Like their big smile no matter what. And I really enjoy Indian children".

As part of the basis for evaluating their work for credit, the students were asked to report closely on one of the conferences attended.

Mrs. Vardy wrote on the Saskatoon Indian Culture College where the mature Indian's education is upgraded so he can go back to the remote reserves and help others.

She passed with 75% plus.

The reports will be collated and made available to interested persons. Also, a series of film strips with sound track and manual is being prepared for publication and sale.

Mrs. Vardy was surprised at the make up of the class. Many of them were public school teachers and very few had any contact with the Indian.

They teach white children, but didn't like what they were teaching

about Canada's natives, she said.

And some of the young people who never had any contact with the Indian "were almost physically hurt at some of the things they saw". Injustices against the Indian? "It's a wonder they haven't exploded".

One of the problems we have is that "we don't accept the Indian as different from the white man," she said. "We expect him to be a little white man.... Indians aren't materialistic."

Using minor examples, Mrs. Vardy explained when an Indian uses the term brother, he means all kinds of people. When the white man says brother, he means family.

Or, when a boy comes to school without a note and explains his "old lady" forgot to write one, he might get a detention.

While old is a derogatory term to the whites, it is a term of respect to the Indian-someone who helps, leads or is a guardian.

It's difficult, she said. The Indian doesn't write everything down. Information on him is generally done by a white man who gives a different interpretation.
